## Statement of Canada's Reservations Regarding the 38<sup>th</sup> International Civil Aviation Organization General Assembly Resolution: Consolidated Statement of Continuing ICAO Policies and Practices Related to Environmental Protection – Climate Change

Canada would like to thank the Secretary General, the President of the Assembly and the President of Council for their efforts during the 38<sup>th</sup> General Assembly and acknowledge the achievements made on the issue of climate change.

However, as noted during the plenary session of the General Assembly on October 3, 2013, Canada would like to make a reservation on paragraph 16b and paragraph (p) in the Annex of the General Assembly Resolution: Consolidated Statement of Continuing ICAO Policies and Practices Related to Environmental Protection – Climate Change.

These reservations reflect Canada's continuing concerns around the incorporation of Common but Differentiated Responsibilities, which is a principle under the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change, into the Resolution, whether by principle or by practice, which appear to be incompatible with the principles that govern international civil aviation activity.

Canada remains committed to continuing to address greenhouse gas emissions from international aviation at the International Civil Aviation Organization through a broad basket of measures.
