CHALLENGES BEING OBSERVED IN AFRICA



Passenger charges at many airoports

vary b/n \$40-\$120 Vs world average is about \$25 The Price of fuel

Well above the world average

- Negatively affects the competitiveness of African airlines
- A direct influence on the cost of products and indeed on the consumer's choice of destination

Lome Declaration Way Forward 7

The impact of taxes, charges and other levies on aviation, should be assessed, and action to be taken in order to limit their effect

ACTORISE.

WAY FORWARD

- Urge member States to join the Champion States which have made a Solemn Commitment for the establishment of the SAATM;
- Request States to expedite notification to the AUC and AFCAC on the concrete measures taken by them towards the establishment of SAATM;
- conceptual distinction between a charge and a tax should be adhered;
- charges should be applied towards defraying the costs of providing facilities and services;
