GUIDE FOR PRESENTATIONS FROM REPRESENTATIVES OF EMISSIONS UNITS PROGRAMMES, MECHANISMS AND PROJECTS

Representatives from emissions units programmes, mechanisms and projects will provide presentations and share information on various aspects of emissions units programmes, mechanisms and projects. Each presentation is assigned a slot of maximum 15 minutes after which the next presenter will be called. Presentations should be structured to address the following standardized questions:

1. How are the emissions units generated by your programme, mechanism or project?

Presenters are invited to elaborate on:

- the carbon markets for which the emissions units are generated (e.g., compliance, voluntary);
- the process from the implementation of a project to the issuance of an emissions unit;
- the volumes of emissions units generated;
- the project types (e.g., renewable energy, energy efficiency, waste management, capture and destruction or storage of gases, afforestation/reforestation, REDD+), the sector (e.g., energy, transport (road, aviation, etc.), industrial processes, agriculture, forestry, waste), and geographical scope (e.g., sub-national, national, regional) in which the emissions units are generated;
- details and examples of existing projects; and outlooks of planned activities.

2. What are the features and benefits of the emissions units generated by your programme, mechanism or project, including the means to ensure their quality?

Presenters are invited to elaborate on:

- how the programme, mechanism or project ensures the quality and environmental integrity of the emissions units;
- the use of quality standards and/or the development, implementation and validation of criteria and protocols that the programme, mechanism or project has to fulfil to be implemented and be eligible to issue emissions units;
- the features and co-benefits of the emissions units beyond environmental integrity.

3. Where can potential buyers purchase the emissions units generated by your programme, mechanism or project?

Presenters are invited to elaborate on:

- how buyers can obtain the generated emissions units from the programme, mechanism or project;
- the role of intermediaries (e.g., websites, platforms, brokers, funds, trade exchanges) between the programme, mechanism or project and the potential buyer;
- whether the emissions units are available globally;
- the requirements for buyers to gain access to the emissions units.

4. How does your programme, mechanism or project track the use of emissions units?

Presenters are invited to elaborate on:

- how the emissions units are identified and tracked by the programme, mechanism or project from the issuance to the cancellation and the usage of serialization (serial numbers);
- the avoidance of double counting of the emissions units (i.e., the same emissions unit is used only once for any mitigation obligation);
- the features, structures and regulations of the registry of the programme, mechanism or project and access requirements for potential buyers of emissions units to the registry.

General guidelines for presentations:

- use self-explanatory pictures or diagrams rather than text, to the extent possible;
- avoid detailed/complicated tables with data, to the extent possible;
- in case of text, work with key words and headlines instead of full text copies;
- it is strongly advised to keep the number of slides at a maximum of 10.
