Gold Standard introduction

A standard and certification body that stands for the best that can be achieved in climate and development projects



- Founded in 2003 by international NGOs, including WWF
- Swiss non-profit headquartered in Geneva
- Used worldwide to certify emission reduction projects in the voluntary and compliance carbon markets








A next-generation standard to quantify, certify and maximise impacts toward climate security and sustainable development

One comprehensive 'meta-standard' for ease of use and flexible certification pathways








5 key principles

- Internationally recognized methodologies
- Third party verification
- Project review by NGO network and independent Technical Advisory Committee
- Final certification decision taken by Gold Standard
- Grievance mechanism
- Exclusion of high-risk project types
- Online secure and transparent carbon registry
- Option to use GS as quality label to CDM projects to ensure safeguards and contributions to SD





Required contributions to Sustainable Development Goals





Different methods:

- Self-proposed and robustly justified indicators, linked to SDG targets
- Submission of reporting tool for Gold Standard approval
- Gold Standard-approved activity-specific SDG tools that encourage the reporting of a wide range of benefits



Secure online environmental registry

- Hosted by Markit, an international environmental registry
- Online registry enables participants to:
 - Track Gold Standard projects and certification documentation
 - Hold, transact and retire carbon credits
 - Serial numbers linked to the project, vintage and verification event
 - Retirement notifications
 - GS CER labels are also tracked in the Gold Standard Registry
