


Humanitarian aid following earthquakes, typhoons, drought, floods, volcanic events ...






Direct jobs generated by Asia Pacific's share of air transport, 2010



global passenger traffic, 2010




Asia Pacific's jobs and GDP generated by air transport, 2010





Global airline industry profitability




- Margins squeezed by high oil prices

Airline capital structure by region




EV = Enterprise Value = Long-term Debt + Market Capitalisation Revenues FY2011; Market Capitalisation as of 4 April 2012




Airline Enterprise Values by Region



Aspirational Demand for Air Travel




Asia Pacific traffic will grow significantly

Asia Pacific fleet expansion




Closing Thoughts
