What is a UN Laissez Passer?

- Used to identify staff eligible for protection under the relevant Conventions on the Privileges and Immunities of the UN and its Specialized Agencies.
- Only to be used when travelling on behalf of the United Nations.
- Nationality and birthplace are not represented. Individual is travelling as an International Civil Servant, not a National of their home Country



Strategic Partnership with ICA

Partnership is a commitment not only to adopt eMRTD technology, but to meet or exceed the best standards for it.

Mutual goal is to be an example for Member States looking to upgrade to an e-Travel Document using best practices such as PKD participation.

Strategic Partnership with ICA


ICAO has consulted on the entire process

- Evaluating needs of the UN
- Drafting the Request for Proposal
- Evaluating the proposals
- Advising on technical terms of the contract
- Provide expert analysis of new document feature selection
- Continued to be engaged through implementation and launch.

Goals

- Goal: to have the e-UNLP be of an equal or greater security profile to any National Passport issued by our member states
- Goal: to maintain the existing 63 Member States granting Visa Waiver while removing any obstacle preventing the remaining 130 from also granting Visa Waiver



- Benefit: As more countries grant this waiver to the e-UNLP:
 - Staff will benefit from safer and more efficient travel to and from their missions.
 - Member States needing assistance will enjoy faster response
 - All Member States will save due to more efficient travel of staff



Three Prong Approach

- Upgrade to eUNLP Document
 - Procure eMRTD booklet stock & personalization equipment
 - Follow 9303 in both letter and spirit
 - Join ICAO PKD
- Strengthen systems and procedures
 - Issue new e-UNLP handling rules following ICAO Assessment Guide
 - Fully participate in Interpol SLTD database
 - Continually improve applicant validation as various systems of record become available through "One-UN"
 - Procure facial recognition system in December 2012
- Educate holders on value of eUNLP
 - Asset of the organization not personal property
 - Accountability for safekeeping

The New e-UNLP

- eBooklets and personalization system provided by De La Rue
- Fully compliant MRTD:
 - One person one document
 - Issuance for a non-renewable five-year duration
- Continued emphasis on secure printing features in addition to chip
 - Unique security background per page
 - Bespoke multi-tonal cylinder mould made watermark
 - Laser perforated serial number
- CSCA provided by Entrust
- UN became PKD's 31st participant in August 2012

Focus on Process

- Upgrade procedures using ICAO Assessment Guide best practices
- Continually strengthening application process since 2007
 - Centralized real-time system used to issue LPs, manage and check the identities of applicants using fuzzy in-line search
 - Continue adding systems to cross check
 - Human Resources, Phone and computer accounts
 - Will be adding facial recognition component in December 2012
- Stock procedures and controls tightened
 - Operators cannot pick booklet to be personalized must use next available
 - No one individual can produce a UNLP
 - Reduce from three to two issuing locations



Culture of Accountability

- New electronic booklet used as opportunity to remind holders of value of document.
 - Responsibilities of holder emphasized and printed in e-UNLP
- More stringent application and usage procedures broadcast to applicants as old style UNLPs are replaced
 - Clear penalties for failure to safe keep eUNLPs for both holders and administrators
