

In 2006, civil aviation contributed U.S.\$3,560 billion to the world economy

In 2006, 7.5% of total GDP

In 2006, generated 32 million jobs globally through direct, indirect induced and catalytic impacts

Contribution of Civil Aviation — Asia/Pacific Employment


- Direct employment = 1.9 million jobs
- **Direct, Indirect and Induced factors = 3.2 million jobs**






Contribution of Civil Aviation — World

- **41.6 million tonnes of freight, 2007**






Contribution of Civil Aviation – World

Contribution of Civil Aviation — Asia/Pacific Employment


- Economy maintained upward trend with a 7.5% growth rate
 - China and India : 11.9% and 9.3% respectively
- **GDP of Japan and ASEAN countries grew 2.1% and 6.3 respectively**
