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

# Process Steps



# Strategic process phases for an operator

1. Commercial intention to start new operation on station
2. Business case development with time schedules
3. Risk analyses for specific time frame at station
4. Gathering data on wildlife risks (!!)
5. Balancing risks vs. benefits
6. Management decision
7. Actual flights (and incidents) → Operational phase

# Operational process phases

1. Crew is informed about Wildlife @ airport (NOTAM)
2. Crew experiences Wildlife Strike.
3. Crew informs ATC
4. Feedback is given by ATC / WL Control:
  1. WL species
  2. (un)confirmed strike
5. Aircraft Technical Log (ATL) entry is made
6. Damage report is written  
→ disruption of operations
  1. Crew
  2. Aircraft
  3. Airport capacity
7. If possible: verbal contact with airport WL Control  
– Airport creates Incident Report.
8. Airline Air Safety Report (ASR) is written → Tactical Phase

# Tactical process phases

1. Airline analyses trends in WL strikes, based on ASRs
2. Airline consults with airport authority to improve WL strike prevention for Major (or Top-x worst) airports
3. Airline/airport combines data into ONE 'truth' .
4. Airline informs/consults IATA on required actions
5. Airports take action to improve
6. If successful, no further action but monitoring
7. If not, scale up influence, than feedback to strategic phase to influence time schedules of frequency of current schedules. → Strategic Phase

# Next Steps

- Improve reporting by crew
- Lower 'boundaries' for informing other parties (Just Culture in reporting)
- Develop workshops in sensitive regions.
- Exchange data (requires new techniques).
