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MAIN MENU

Durante as 313 horas de monitoramento da fauna realizadas no sítio aeroportuário do SBAR, foram registradas 153 espécies de animais, sendo 127 espécies de aves, 12 espécies de répteis, duas de anfíbios e 12 de mamíferos (Anexo A).

Entre julho de 2012 e agosto de 2013, os números máximos mensais de indivíduos das aves mais relevantes para a aviação apresentaram flutuação. O urubu-de-cabeça-preta foi mais abundante durante o mês de agosto de 2012. Os registros do quero-quero foram relativamente constantes ao longo do ano, com picos máximos em julho e agosto de 2013. Já os carcarás apresentaram maiores concentrações em outubro de 2012, julho e agosto de 2013 (Figura 6).




Figura 7: Número médio de indivíduos por área amostrada na pista de pouso e decolagem do SBAR
