I wish to invite your Administration/Organization to participate in the Directors General Course on Aviation Safety, to be convened in Kingston, Jamaica, from 14 to 15 May 2015, immediately after the Fourteenth Directors of Civil Aviation of the Central Caribbean Meeting (C/CAR/DCA/14) which will be hosted by the Jamaica Civil Aviation Authority at a venue to be determined in the near future.

The objective of this executive course is to provide the DGs/Senior Officials with specific knowledge regarding the international civil aviation safety framework, and the underlying principles that will enable them to carry out their responsibilities to ensure the effective management of aviation safety in their States. Through presentations and discussions, the two day course will first focus on the international civil aviation framework and then on the development of a National Aviation Safety Framework that supports the development of civil aviation in their respective States. An outline of the course is attached.

You are invited to visit the website periodically. As participation is limited to 25 delegates, DGs/Senior Officials desirous to attend the course should forward their Registration Form (attached) by 13 April 2015. Depending on the number of nominations received, this Regional Office will notify States/Territories of the successful course participation accordingly. You may wish to note that the course will be conducted in English only, with simultaneous interpretation to Spanish.
