- → We carry 3.5 Billion passengers.
- → Aviation supports 58 MILLION Jobs.
- → 50 Million Tonnes of Cargo.

- Aviation sector contributed \$US138 billion to region's total GDP

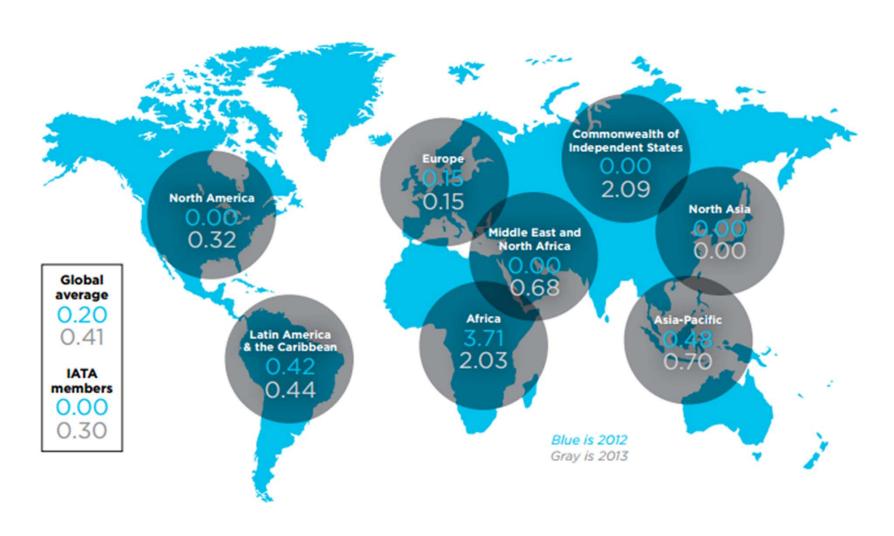




WESTERN BUILT JET HULL LOSS RATE



Per million sectors.

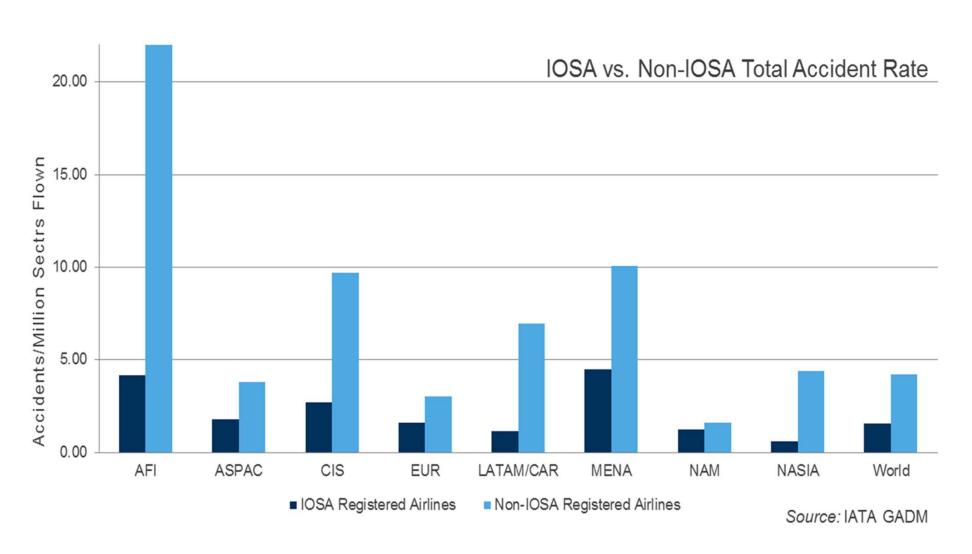




IOSA vs. NON-IOSA ACCIDENT RATES

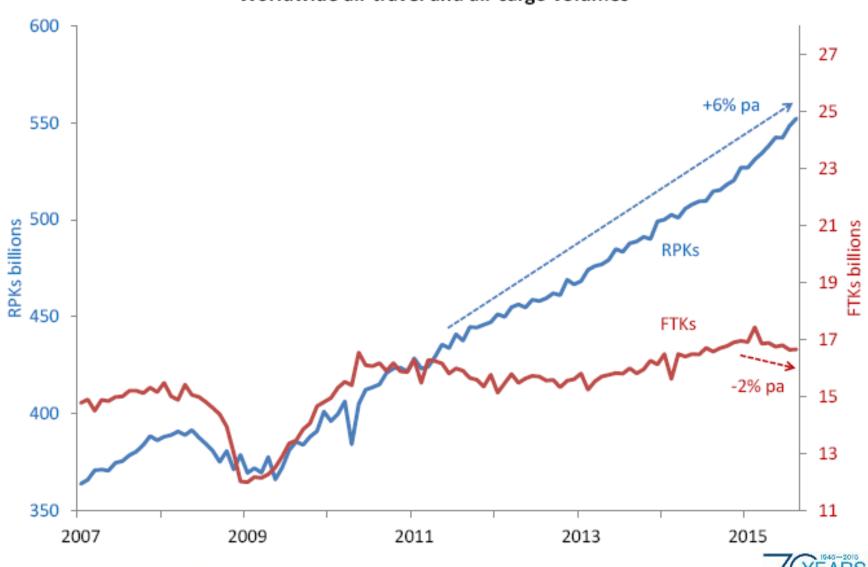

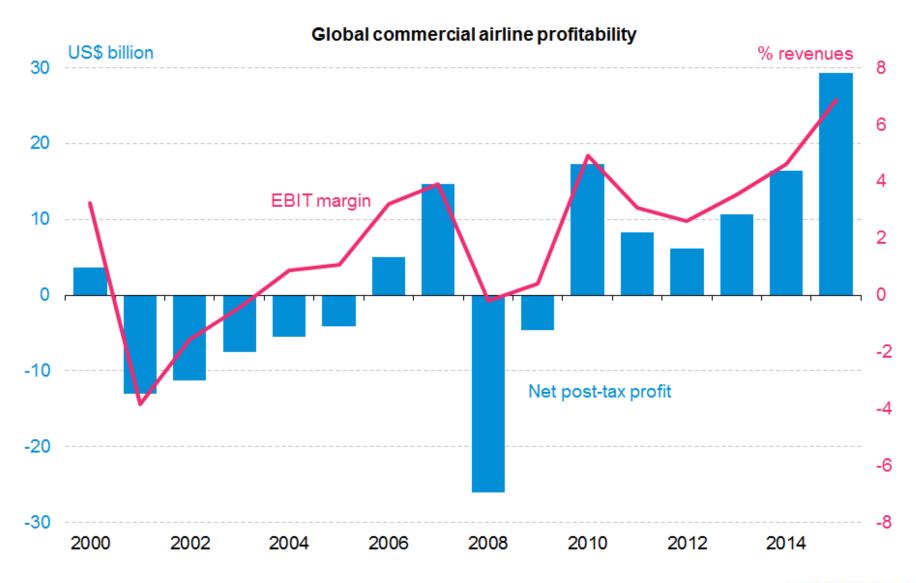


Worldwide air travel and air cargo volumes

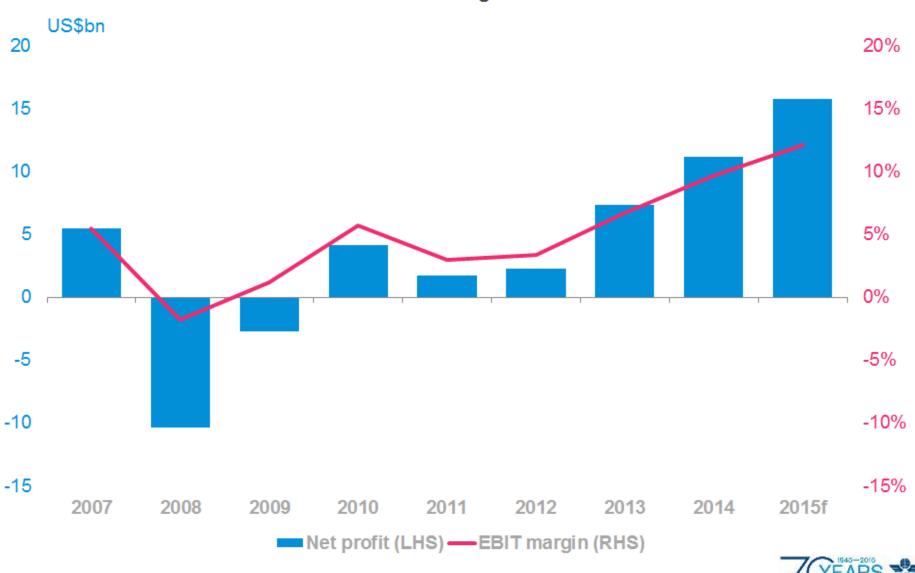




NORTH AMERICA INDUSTRY FINANCES STRONG



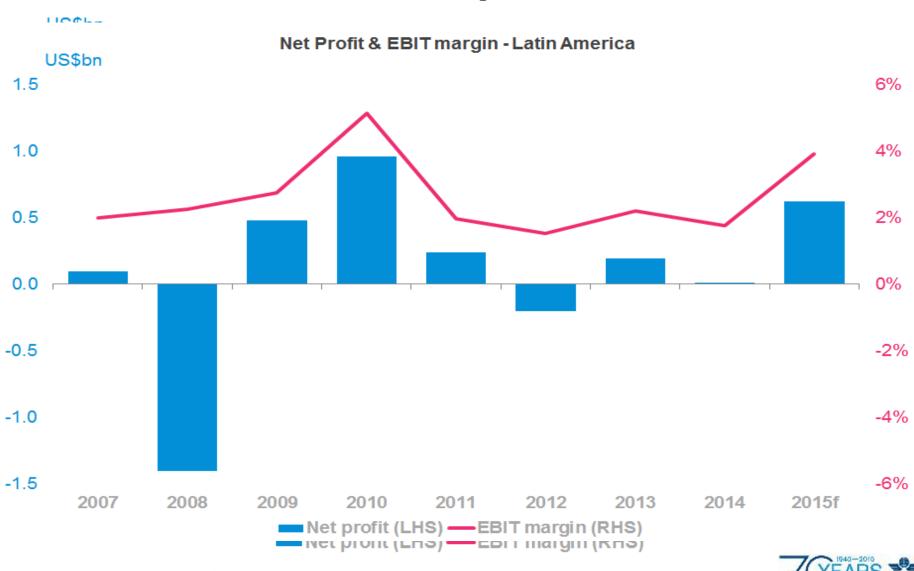
Net Profit & EBIT margin - Nth America



MUCH LESS SO IN LATAM & CARIBBEAN





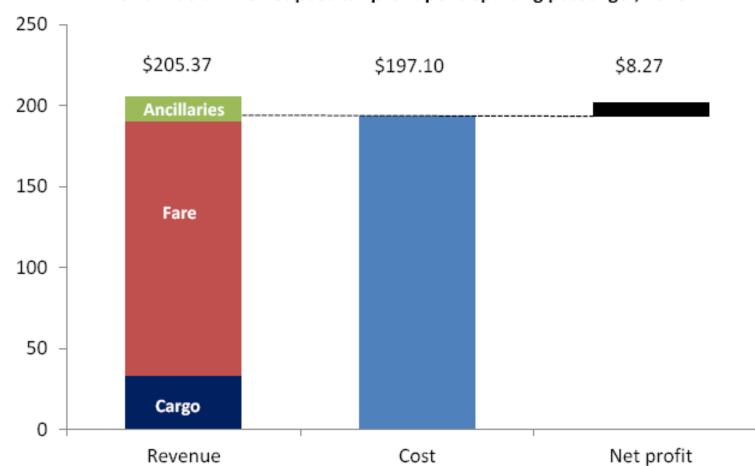


GLOBAL PROFITS

Worldwide airline net post-tax profit per departing passenger, 2015

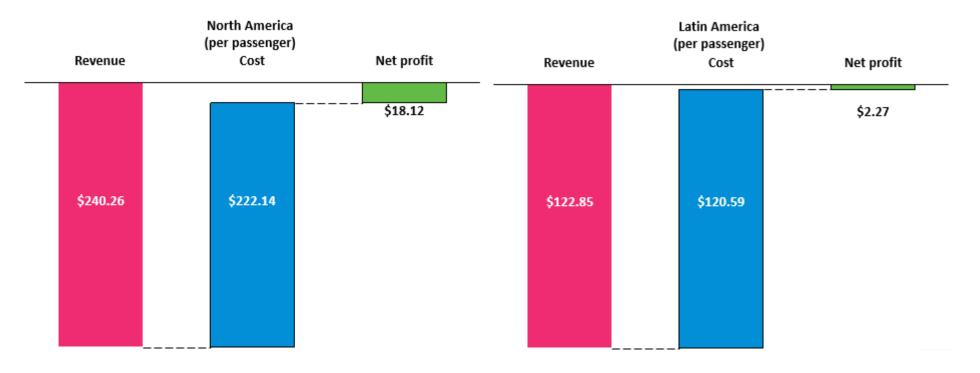

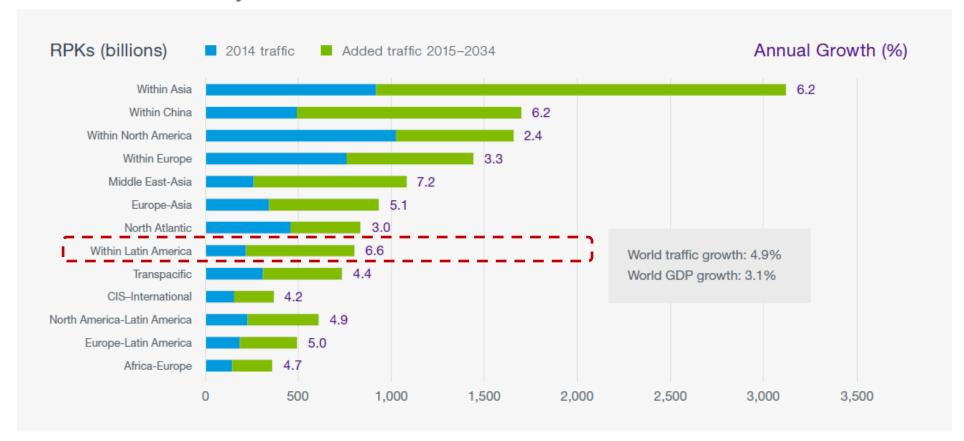


LONG TERM PROJECTIONS POSITIVE

World traffic varies by market



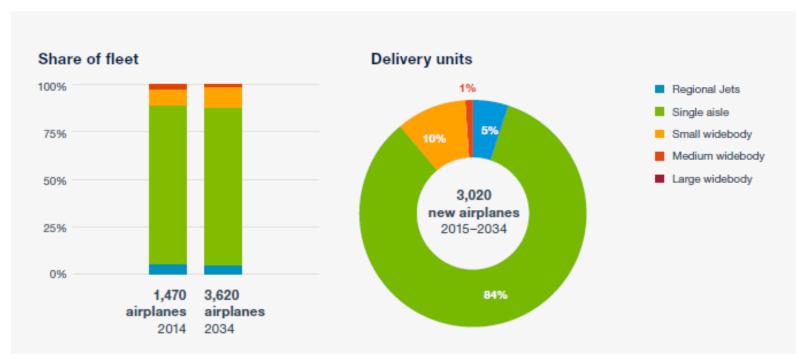


FLEET TO DOUBLE BY 2034

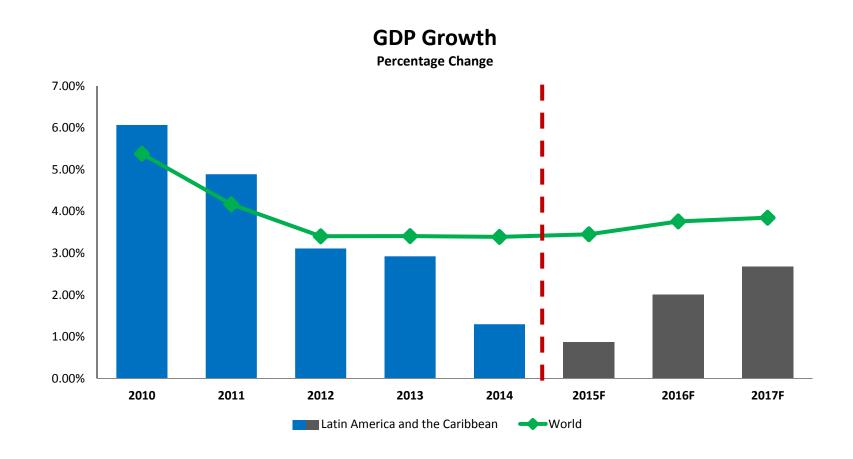


Latin America & Caribbean:

LATAM SLOWER THAN REST OF WORLD

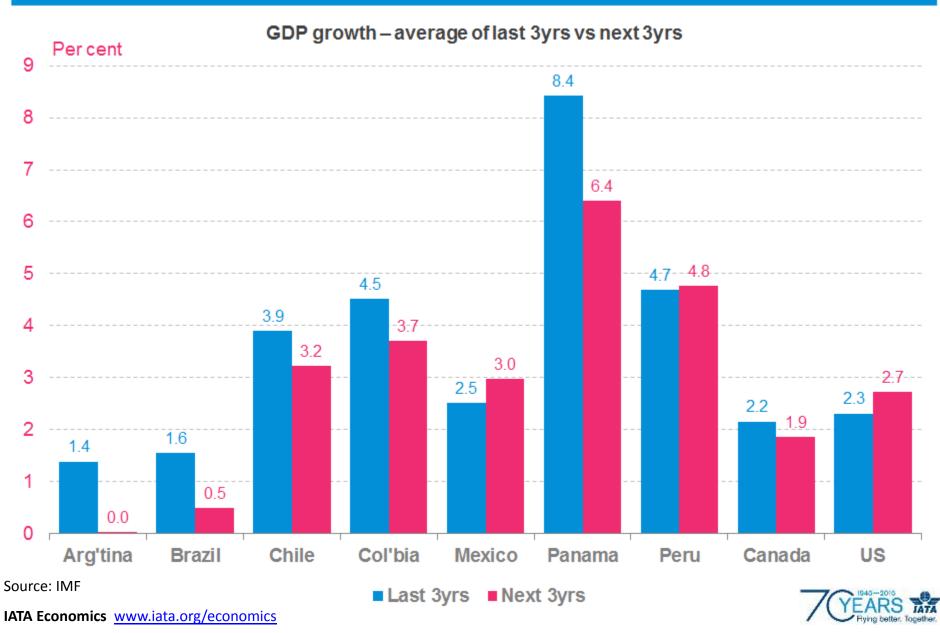






GDP GROWTH OUTLOOK MIXED

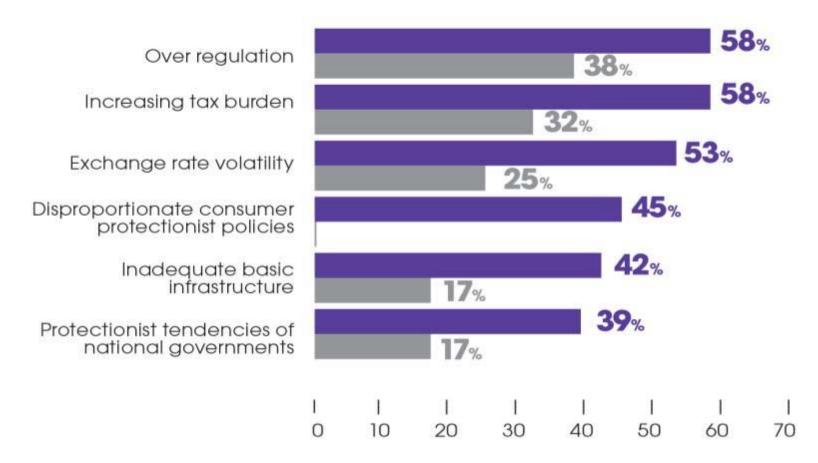

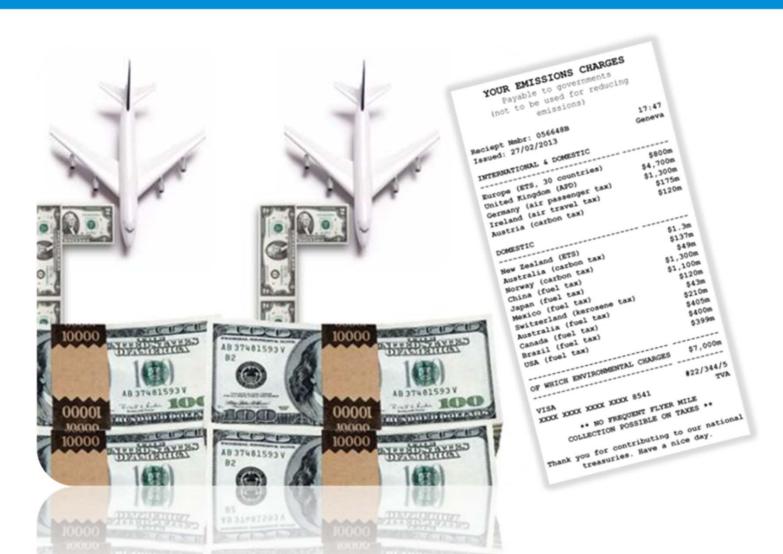

CHARGES & TAXATION







TAXATION EXAMPLE: CARIBBEAN



Each \$1 of ticket tax could lead to:

- Over 40,000 fewer foreign passengers
- \$20M of reduced tourist expenditure
- 7 1,200 fewer jobs





AIRPORTS & ATM INFRASTRUCTURE



- Demand exceeds capacity.
 - 7 Infrastructure does not support today's needs.
- 7 Congested and inefficient airspace.
 - **7** PBN implementations is slow.
 - Airspace redesign is lagging.

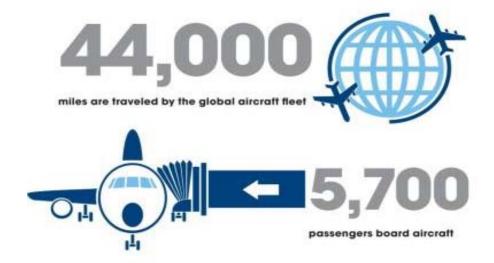

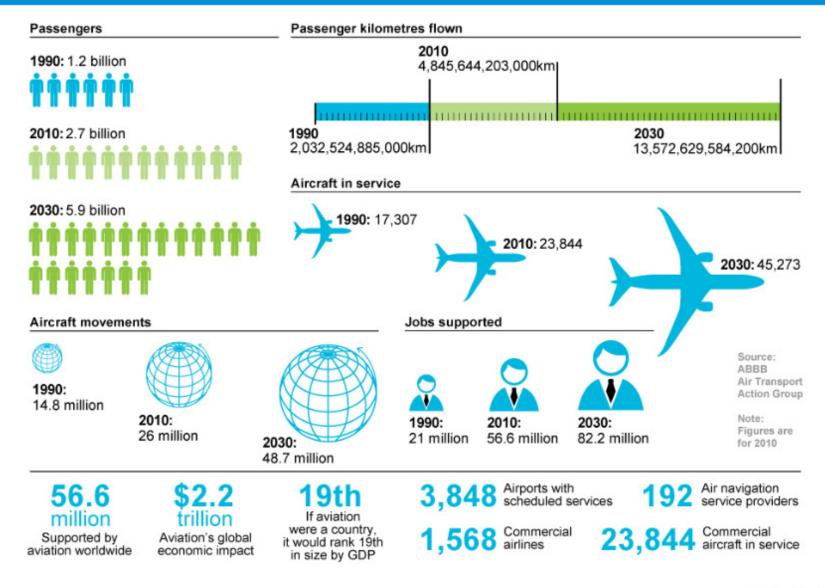

REGIONAL STRATEGIC GOALS



- 7 Reduce fatalities by 50% by 2020 (2010 data)
- → ATC: Implement ASBU/ Block I (2018)
- Ensure that the airport infrastructure supports the projected 6% passenger growth by 2020
- Place aviation on the governmental agenda in the key markets
