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What is an IPack?

An Implementation Package (IPack) is a self-contained package composed of the relevant:

- **guidance material**, including ICAO Annexes, Documents, Circulars, best-practices papers or other associated guidance material;
- **standardized training**, including standardized and competency based trainings, in classroom, online or virtual formats;
- **tools**, including data-driven application, online reporting systems, electronic management systems or questionnaire/surveys;
- subject matter expertise, including the provision of experts to support field operations; and
- guidance for procurement, with regards to the purchase of infrastructure or equipment.

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Expected Outcomes of an iPack

Facilitate alignment with measures and recommendations contained in the Council Aviation Recovery Task Force (CART) Report, by:


- Providing support for States in their aviation restart, recovery and resilience efforts as well as re-engagement with industry;
- Applying the most up-to-date ICAO provisions and other international requirements and guidance related to | public health; and
- Providing an "all-in-one" and user-friendly bundle of implementation support.

Support in ensuring appropriate oversight functions articulated by USOAP activities in promoting adherence to international standards and best practices.



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Strengthening National Air Transport Facilitation Committees for the Re-start and the Resilience of Civil Aviation

GOAL

Apply Annex 9 provisions for the establishment and operation of a resilient and robust National Facilitation Committee with full collaboration and cooperation with all stakeholders including Public Health authorities with remote communication protocols in response to pandemics.


OBJECTIVES

After having successfully implemented this iPACK, CAAs and/or lead agencies in charge of coordinating, drafting, and implementing the National Air Transport Facilitation Programme (NATFP) will be better equipped to:

- 1) Develop or review and update existing national provisions related to the establishment of a NATFP;
- 2) Develop or review and update existing national provisions for the establishment of National Air Transport Facilitation Committees and Airport Facilitation Committees; and
- 3) Establish a reporting and coordination mechanism between the CAA and other involved key stakeholders in light of COVID-19.

TARGET AUDIENCE

- Civil Aviation Authorities; and/or
- Lead agencies in charge of coordinating, drafting, and implementing the NATFP.





Aviation Safety Risk Management related to COVID-19 for CAAs

GOAL

Facilitate and guide Civil Aviation Authorities (CAAs) in applying safety risk management principles to improve decision making to address COVID-19 challenges and support safe aircraft operations.

OBJECTIVES

After having successfully implemented this iPACK, Civil Aviation Authorities will be better equipped to:

- 1) Improve the effectiveness of remote collaboration, coordination and communication among the stakeholders involved in addressing the pandemic;
- 2) Improve the use of safety data and information to support decision-making for the restart of aviation activities;
- 3) Increase the capability of CAAs to assess their priorities during the COVID-19 pandemic and plan for the restart of aviation operations;
- 4) Increase the State's capability to appropriately apply safety risk mitigations;
- 5) Improve strategies for planning and conducting surveillance using a risk-based approach; and
- 6) Achieve progress in the implementation and maturity of the State safety programme (SSP).

TARGET AUDIENCE

- CAAs or groups of CAAs from a region or sub-region; and
- Regional Safety Oversight Organizations (RSOOs), including Cooperative Development of Operational Safety and Continuing Airworthiness Programmes (COSCAPs).





Strengthen Aviation Security during the COVID-19 Pandemic

GOAL

Supporting ICAO Member States that are in need of assistance to build and strengthen their ability to meet obligations for civil aviation security under the Chicago Convention and to facilitate and guide Appropriate Authorities (AA) for Aviation Security protecting civil aviation against acts of unlawful interference during the COVID-19 pandemic.


OBJECTIVES

After having successfully implemented this iPACK, AAs in charge of coordinating, drafting national rules and regulations for implementing the ICAO Annex 17 provisions will be better equipped to:

- 1) Improve the effectiveness of remote collaboration, coordination and communication between ICAO, the State and its aviation stakeholders;
- 2) Increase the State's capability to apply risk management principles and manage aviation security risks;
- 3) Improve strategies for planning and conducting aviation security monitoring activities using a risk-based approach; and
- 4) Achieve progress in the implementation and development of the State National Civil Aviation Security Programme.

TARGET AUDIENCE

Appropriate Authorities for Aviation Security (AAs).



The support will be provided through Implementation Packages (IPACKs).


What is an Implementation Package (iPACK)?

An iPACK is a bundle of standardized guidance material, training, tools and expert support which aim to facilitate and guide the implementation of ICAO provisions for State entities (e.g. Governments, Civil Aviation Authorities, National Air Transport Facilitation Committees...), aviation service providers, supply chain stakeholders and their personnel. An IPACK is intended to be a self-contained package composed of the relevant:

- guidance material, including ICAO Annexes, Documents, Circulars, best-practices papers or other associated guidance material:
- standardized training, including standardized and competency-based trainings, in classroom, online or virtual formats;
- tools, including data-driven applications, online reporting systems, electronic management systems or questionnaire/surveys;
- subject matter expertise, including the provision of experts to support States in their activities; and
- guidance for procurement, with regards to the purchase of infrastructure or equipment.

iPACKs are developed and implemented in full alignment with the measures and recommendations contained in the Council Aviation Recovery Task Force (CART) Report and are a key element for their implementation.
