Aruba's Vision

Steps for Aruba

- Establish working groups (legal, ICT, financial, operational, technical);
- Perform gap analysis (legal, ICT, financial, operational and technical);
- Develop action plan;
- Allocate funds;
- Promote and engage with stakeholders (encourage cooperation rather than competitiveness);
- Set-up pilot project;
- Move towards regional integration of project.





Key Points to Consider

- What needs to be adapted in Aruba's regulations? Some regulatory changes may take years.
- Aruba has not (yet) signed the Montreal Convention...is this a deal breaker?
- What are the financial implications for this project?
- Promotion of cargo 7th freedom bi-multilateral agreements in parallel is essential.
- Cybersecurity.
- Data protection.
- Alignment of the legal framework with the principles captioned in the Model
 Law on Electronic Transferable Records and in reference to the eAWB.

Outcomes and ICAO's role

- 1. Upcoming ICAO Assembly (Sep 2022)
- Establish a task force that will develop for ICAO Assembly 41 a strategic document that would guide ICAO's work programme to ensure safety, security, capacity and efficiency, sustainability as well as resilience vis-à-vis air cargo and the broader supply chain.
- Aruba plans to co-write a working paper with respect to the above and highlighting the importance and benefits of the project.
- 2. (Continue to) increase awareness amongst stakeholders of ICAO work in digital transformation in reference to digital transport and trade.
- 3. Provide assistance/guidance to member States specific to air cargo supply chain digitalization.
- 4. ICAO to actively engage with WCO (World Customs Organization).
- 5. All states and stakeholders are encouraged to provide additional feedback as to what (additional) role can ICAO play with respect to the topic.
