Thilly De Bodt Biography

Thilly has worked for over 20 years in international multilateral development organizations, predominantly for the United Nations at the country, regional and



headquarters levels in resource mobilization, partnerships, advocacy, adolescent participation and gender equality.

Until recently, Thilly was the Head of the Strategic Planning, Coordination and Partnerships Office (SPCP) in the Office of the Secretary General of the International Civil Aviation Organization. In this capacity she advised the office of the SG on Business Planning and systems and approaches for making the organization better fit for purpose. She also oversaw cross-organizational work on innovation and leads ICAO-wide engagement with the UN, particularly the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). Thilly is overseeing the follow up on the A41-26 resolution on Gender equality in the aviation sector and has been in charge of organizing the Global Aviation Gender Summits and driving forward gender mainstreaming in ICAO.

Thilly now moved to the Capacity Development and Implementation (CDI) Bureau where she will be heading a unit focused on gender equality mainstreaming in icao and the aviation sector, the development of the global ambassadors Programme for gender equality, diversity and inclusion, cross-sectoral partnerships in support of ICAO strategic goals as well as support resource mobilization efforts and having promising talent join the organization and the aviation sector.

Prior to joining ICAO in 2017, Thilly worked for UNICEF where she was the senior advisor on planning and partnerships. In this capacity she represented UNICEF in a unique interdisciplinary partnership in which 11 UN agencies come together to orchestrate concerted action in the fight against HIV and AIDS. Earlier in her career, Thilly advised on social mobilization strategies for polio eradication and advocated the importance of consulting and partnering with grassroots communities in support of health initiatives. Thilly started her UN career working for the United Nations Population Fund in Chile and Haiti on HIV prevention among young people

and adolescents. Prior to joining the UN Thilly worked at the European Union in public communication outreach.

Thilly studied Roman Philology in Antwerp, Belgium and holds a master's in business communication from the Toulouse Business School. Thilly is fluent in Dutch, French, Spanish and English. She bicycles to work all year round (even during Canadian winters) and ran 8 marathons in support of cancer research.
