### **NACC ASBU TASK FORCE STATUS UPDATES**

(Presented by the NACC/WG/ASBU TF Rapporteur)

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

This working paper presents the status of NACC ASBU TF and its accomplishments since NACC/WG/8. The ASBU/TF prepared the National Air Navigation Plan (NANP) template and NANP supporting materials that are aligned with the 7<sup>th</sup> edition of ASBU. Using these materials, ICAO NACC RO organized the NANP Workshop in August 2024 for Spanish-speaking states. During the NANP Workshop, ICAO NACC explained the plans for the 8<sup>th</sup> edition of GANP/ASBU and the importance of KPIs and CAR/SAM Regional Planning and Implementation Group (GREPECAS) electronic Air Navigation Plan (eANP) Volume III. Most importantly, all seven States participated in the NANP Workshop and successfully updated the draft NANP. A similar NANP Workshop is scheduled in January 2025 for the English-speaking States.

### 1. Introduction

1.1. The Aviation System Block Upgrades (ASBU) Task Force (TF) was established during the NACC/WG/5 Meeting held in Trinidad and Tobago in May 2017. The objective of the ASBU TF is to facilitate the region in the implementation of harmonized technologies that support the operation guided by the ICAO Global Air Navigation Plan (GANP) and the Aviation System Block Upgrades (ASBU).

- 1.2. The ASBU TF work programme covers the basis for the preparation and maintenance of National Air Navigation Plans (NANPs) by ICAO Member States, organization, and territories in the region. To effectively prepare and maintain the NANPs, states need to understand GANP/ASBU in conjunction with their states' current and future needs in aviation technologies. The NANP should be used by the states to strategically plan what capability will be implemented and when to implement it.
- 1.3. The ICAO publishes a new edition of GANP/ASBU every 3 years. The technological improvement requirements of states also changes while the complex circumstances surrounding them changes. Therefore, it is necessary to periodically update NANPs to align with the newer edition of GANP/ASBU while addressing new and old needs of states.

# 2. Status of ASBU editions and NANP in CAR region

- 2.1. To advance the ASBU editions, the ICAO Assembly agreed on the expansion of the GANP lifecycle through three-year minor and six-year major updates, as relevant, to provide for stability during its 39<sup>th</sup> Session. The ICAO issued the ASBU 5th edition in 2016, followed by the 6<sup>th</sup> edition (minor) in 2019 and the 7<sup>th</sup> edition (major) in 2022. The ASBU 8<sup>th</sup> edition will bring major changes by making Block 2 Elements available for implementation. The 8<sup>th</sup> edition was brought to the 14<sup>th</sup> Air Navigation Conference (AN-CONF/14) on 26 August to 6 September 2024 in Montreal, Canada. It is expected to be approved at the 42<sup>nd</sup> session of the ICAO Assembly scheduled for the fall of 2025.
- 2.2. The ASBU Task Force worked with Saint Lucia and created the NANP template based on the 5th edition of ASBU. In 2018, the NACC RO identified 20 states, one territory, and one organization in the CAR region that should prepare their NANPs. The NACC RO organized three NANP Workshops (WS) in 2018; the 1st NANP WS in Mexico City, Mexico from March 12-15, 2018, hosted by ICAO NACC RO; the 2nd NANP WS in Tegucigalpa, Honduras from August 6-9, 2018, hosted by COCESNA; and the 3rd NANP WS in Bridgetown, Barbados from November 6-9, 2018, hosted by Barbados. As a result, 18 states/territory/organization successfully submitted their NANPs. These NANPs are based on the 5<sup>th</sup> edition of ASBU and focused on the needs and implementation status of ASBU Elements.
- 2.3. In 2024, the NACC RO determined to organize two workshops to create or revise NANPs from the 5th edition base to the 7th edition base. One NANP WS is for Spanish-speaking states, and one is for English-speaking states. The 7th edition based NANP templates, Handbook, Air Navigation Reporting Forms (ANRFs) are prepared. The NACC RO hosted the 1st NACC/WG ASBU Task Force On-line Meeting (ASBU/TF/01) on 14 June 2024 and introduced the 7th edition of NANP template and supporting materials.
- 2.4. As Multi-Regional Assistance Program for Civil Aviation (MCAAP), the ICAO NACC RO organized the Spanish-speaking NANP WS to update of NANP to align with the 7th edition of ASBU on August 12 to 16, 2024 at San Salvador, El Salvador hosted by Instituto Centroamericano de Capacitación Aeronáutica. Seven states participated and they are: Belize, Cuba, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, Mexico, and Dominican Republic. They all successfully updated their NANPs to the 7th edition of ASBU.
- 2.5. The English-speaking NANP WS is proposed to be held in Jamaica, in February 2025.
- 2.6. The NACC WG ASBU TF webpage will be updated as the 7<sup>th</sup> edition of NANPs will be submitted to the NACC RO.

2.7. As the 8<sup>th</sup> edition of ASBU becomes available in the fall of 2025, the NACC RO and the ASBU Task Force will coordinate the future NANP WS to support states to revise their NANPs.

# 3. ASBU Task Force ToR and Work Program

- 3.1. The ASBU Task Force Terms of Reference (ToR) was last updated on November 8, 2018 (refer to Attachment A). The ASBU TF Work Program was last updated on Aug 26, 2021 (refer to Attachment B). The ASBU TF Work Program has been a useful tool to focus on what tasks are needed to support the region in understanding ASBU and creating NANPs. Many of the tasks identified in the original Work Program were completed. The ASBU TF objectives and responsibilities need to be re-evaluated and both ToR and Work Program needs to be updated accordingly.
- 3.2. The difficulty in adjusting is the transition from the Regional Performance-Based Air Navigation Implementation Plan (RPBANIP) to GREPACAS e-ANP Volume III. It is necessary to discuss with the NACC members regarding their expectations from the regional air navigation plan.

# 4. Suggested actions

- 4.1. The meeting is invited to:
  - a) Note the information contained in this paper.
  - b) Update the NANPs using the template aligned to support the 7<sup>th</sup> edition of ASBU;
  - c) Provide comments and recommendations on revising the NANP.
  - d) Consider and articulate the expectations from the regional air navigation plan.
  - e) Provide the information to the ICAO NACC RO to support GREPECAS e-ANP Volume III development when requested; and
  - f) Provide comments and recommendations on revising the ASBU Task Force Work Program.

# APPENDIX A Terms of Reference Aviation System Block Upgrade (ASBU) Task Force

Dated: 8 November 2018

# 1. Background

- 1.1. At the ANI/WG/2 Meeting in June 2015, an Ad Hoc group was formed to discuss metrics of the ASBU Block 0 implementation status, performance reporting and revisions to the Air Navigation Reporting Forms (ANRF) which will be used by States and Territories in the NAM/CAR regions. In the ANI/WG/2 report, this ad hoc group was named the ANRF Ad Hoc group. Their given tasks are:
  - a) For the NAM/CAR States/Territories to review and adopt the proposed new ANRFs for application by June 2016.
  - b) For the NAM/CAR States/Territories to assess their status of implementation and report to ICAO NACC Regional office by 30 July 2016; and
  - c) For ICAO to organize by the first semester of 2016. a hands-on ANS/ASBU ANRF workshop to improve the use and understanding of the new ANRFs with participation of CANSO, IATA, civil aviation training centers and air navigation planning experts.
- 1.2. At the ANI/WG/3 Meeting in April, 2016, the delegates agreed to more active participation from their States/ANSPs to reflect their national priorities and users' main needs, and therefore agreed to create an ad hoc group to support review, follow-up and reporting on the achievement of the air navigation (AN) targets established in the NAM/CAR Regional Performance-Based Air Navigation Implementation Plan (RPBANIP) and in the Port-of-Spain Declaration. During ANI/WG/3, this ad hoc Group was named the ASBU Ad Hoc Group.
- 1.3. At the NACC/WG/5 Meeting (May 2017), the delegates agreed that the ASBU Ad Hoc Group would become the ANI/WG ASBU Task Force (TF).

# 2. Objectives

To assist the region in the implementation of harmonized technologies that supports the operation.

- 1) Develop effective methods to determine the regional implementation status of the ASBU Block-O elements and the performance monitoring of the Regional Air Navigation System, on a cyclical annual basis, as a regional input to the Annual Global Air Navigation Report and feedback for the Global Air Navigation Plan and the Regional Dashboard.
- 2) Assist NACC's States to formulate or update their National Air Navigation Plans by using a planning process to ensure alignment with the RPBANIP and the GANP.
- 3) Contribute with the continuous updating of the RPBANIP to maintain the validity, accuracy, and applicability of the Plan.

# 3. Responsibilities

The Task Force is responsible for:

- a) Work Programme Management.
- b) Coordination and support of the development and maintenance of State/Territory Air Navigation Plans; and
- c) Support the revision and enhancement of Regional Performance Based Air Navigation Implementation Plan (RPBANIP)

# 4. Working Methods

The Task Force will:

- a) Present its work programme containing activities in terms of objectives, responsibilities, deliverables, and timelines.
- b) Avoid duplicating work within the ANI/WG and maintain close coordination among the existing entities to optimize use of available resources and experience.
- c) Designate, as necessary, ad hoc groups to work on specific topics and activities and organize clearly defined tasks and activities.
- d) Coordinate tasks to maximize efficiency and reduce costs via electronic means including emails, telephone, and teleconference calls, and convene meetings as necessary; and
- e) Report on and coordinate the progress of assigned tasks to the ANI/WG.

# APPENDIX B ASBU TF Work Programme

Updated on Aug 26, 2021

This ASBU Task Force (TF) work programme covers the basis for the preparation and maintenance of State ANPs by each member states in the region. To prepare and maintain the State ANPs, States need to understand GANP/ASBU in addition to their States' needs in current and future aviation technologies. The State ANP should be used by the State to strategically plan what capability will be implemented and when to implement it.

Note 1: This document establishes a guideline for attaining ASBU NAM/CAR goals and will be reviewed periodically throughout the year. A formal review each calendar year shall be conducted during the ANI/WG and NACC/WG meeting so as to update/revise/modify its content for currency and applicability.

Note 2: The GANP/ASBU will be updated every 3 years with ASBU Block definitions maturing every 6 years. Thus, minor updates are expected every 3 years and significant updates are expected every 6 years.
