

What is YOSC?



The **ICAO Year of Security Culture (YOSC)** aims to raise security awareness and promote a positive security culture in aviation operations across the world. It seeks to encourage and facilitate the enhancement of security behaviours and practices, focusing on the principle that security is everyone's responsibility – from the ground up and top-down.

The *ICAO Security Culture website* contains further information on the YOSC and downloadable features e.g. email signature blocks, banners and presentations to help promote the YOSC in all 6 languages of ICAO. The website also contains a wealth of security culture resources and material from ICAO, States and industry. This includes guidance documents, videos, toolkits in multiple languages, training links and articles for your wider dissemination.

ICAO TV contains a link to the fourth annual ICAO Global Aviation Security Symposium 2020 (*AVSEC2020*), where the ICAO Secretary General launched the YOSC. The Symposium, which had the theme of “*Improving Security Culture by Connecting the Dots*”, highlighted best practices to help build and implement a strong and effective security culture within aviation.

What will ICAO be doing?



ICAO will deliver a range of events and activities to support the YOSC. These will be delivered from HQ (Montreal) and through the ICAO Regional Offices and ICAO Aviation Security Training Centres. Information will be available on the security culture website in due course and through local/regional channels.



What can You do?



The YOSC is a global effort. All in aviation are part of it; so we urge everyone to be security culture ambassadors, with security culture philosophy integrated in to everything you do.

States, regional organizations and **industry** are encouraged to take practical security culture actions.


Actions may include:

- Creating display materials amongst your employees, around your offices and through your digital distribution channels, that highlight the importance of security;
- Developing an airport mission statement that promotes an effective security culture;
- Assisting airports and States in the high-level endorsement of policies and procedures that define security culture;
- Providing security culture training (incl. threat awareness training) and continuous learning activities for all staff; and
- Establishing a framework that affords protection to reports and their sources when reporting suspicious behaviour or lapses in airport security.


