Background

- April 2010 deadline for MRPs

Facilitation, Standard 3.10, states should have begun issuing only MRPs in accordance with the specifications of Doc 9303, Part 1, no later than 1 April 2010

- Obtaining official information on compliance status is difficult
- This report by the ICBWG is based on the best information available at this time

Current Status

Small number of Member States are still issuing
hand-written passports

- Afghanistan, Algeria, Central African Republic, Equatorial Guinea, Kiribati, Libya, and Mauritania

- Djibouti and DPRK issue MRPs for diplomatic and service only

- Most appear to have plans or projects to introduce MRPs

Australia providing assistance. Outcome expected in 2011
at the earliest.

eMRP expected by 2011

Central African Republic

Part of CEMAC (ECCAS) MRP project for Central African States. No expected date available.

Djibouti

Keesing shows their diplomatic and service passports to be MRP, but their ordinary passports to be non-MRP.



Non-MRP

Democratic People's Republic of Korea (North Korea)

Keesing shows diplomatic, service and official passports are MRP, but ordinary passports are non-MRP.

Equatorial Guinea

Part of CEMAC (ECCAS) MRP project for Central African States. No expected date available.

Kiribati

Australia Department of Immigration is providing assistance. MRP expected 2012.

Libya

eMRP was expected in late 2011 (contract awarded but expected date now unclear due to political situation).



Non-MRP

Mauritania

eMRP expected in 2011.



MRP Compliance

ICBWG has identified a small number of states with compliance issues with their MRP

- ❑ Benin, Congo, Guinea-Bissau
- ❑ Iran and Tajikistan are resolved
- ❑ ICBWG undertaking further investigation into Laos, Guinea Conakry, East Timor, Somalia

MRP Compliance

ICBWG review of Edison database

- ❑ objective – scan for potential non-compliant passport with may have readability issues
- ❑ scope – review all Passport images

MRP Compliance

- ❑ North Korea – non-compliant, MRZ – Arial font, spacing
- ❑ Saudi Arabia - skew thru MRZ (may be sample only)
- ❑ Bangladesh - MRZ shifts position midway thru lines
- ❑ Sierra Leone – signature in MRZ, skew in MRZ
- ❑ Syria - paper thickness, bar code under shows through in Infrared into MRZ
- ❑ San Marino – clipped last chars on MRZ
- ❑ Indonesia – space in MRL2, only 43 chars (line spacing?)

Letters

- The ICBWG, through the ICAO Secretariat, has corresponded with five states drawing attention to compliance issues with their documents and offering assistance
- To date, only Congo has responded to the Secretariat








Guinea Bissau

MRZ not visible in B900 Infrared





2015 Deadline

- ❑ **Non machine readable passports in circulation after 24 Nov 2015 will no longer be compliant with Annex 9**
- ❑ **Anecdotal evidence suggests there may be a large number of Member States affected by this deadline**
- ❑ **Misconceptions about the requirement of Annex 9 in relation to ePassports – 24 Nov 2015 does not apply**
