# Introduction

- ICAO New Technologies Working Group (NTWG) has conducted an RFI every three years since the mid '90s
- The RFI is used to maintain awareness of new and improving technologies that may provide future benefit to States and the MRTD program



# Process

- The RFI focuses on technologies that can be used in MRTDs, visas and card-based TDs to assist:
  - Assessment of applicant eligibility
  - Document security and production
  - Linking documents/holders to bearers
  - Providing reliable authentication of documents
  - Facilitating secure and reliable transit of passengers

## Process cont'd

- Vendors submit technologies to a selection panel of NTWG members, who rank each submission and create a shortlist of candidates
- Short-listed vendors are invited to present their technology at a special 'government members only' meeting

# RFI 2011

- NTWG identified a specific range of interest areas:

## RFI 2011 (2)

- 94 technology submissions received from 45 vendors
- 29 vendors presented to 66 government representatives from 29 Member States
- Presentations held in the European Commission's Joint Research Centre in Ispra, Italy.

# Summary

- No revolutionary technology proposed
- Some vendors demonstrated innovative thinking and solutions that may develop into new options for MRTD environment
- Presentations largely reflected evolution of known products and technologies
- NTWG looking to broaden reach of RFI in future to encourage more emerging technologies

## Why Should States Participate?

- Awareness of what is available
- Areas of specific interest to your State can be put forward to the vendor community for response
- Advanced warning of aspects you may wish to include in future procurement processes
- Enable interaction, discussion and comparison in a group of knowledgeable peers
