

ICAO STRATEGIC OBJECTIVE: Security and Facilitation

- Enhance global civil aviation security and facilitation
- Reflect the need for ICAO's leadership in aviation security, facilitation and related border control matters
 - <u>SECURITY</u>: minimize the number of incidents of unlawful interference and other security-related events with civil aviation, ensure appropriate responses when incidents occur, and reduce aviation security and border integrity risks
 - <u>FACILITATION</u>: maximize efficiency in border control management and other airport processes to expedite clearance and prevent unnecessary delays, resulting in promoting trade, tourism and conomic development



Annex 17: Security (AVSEC)

- Lead and support global efforts to establish sustainable civil aviation security regimes and oversight systems to:
 - prevent unlawful interference with civil aviation;
 - respond effectively to attacks and attempted attacks; and
 - assure the safe and efficient movement of people and goods

"Provide **technical assistance to States** in need, including funding, capacity building and technology transfer to effectively address security threats to civil aviation, in cooperation with other States, international organizations and industry partners."

ICAO SECURITY & FACILITATION (FAL)

Facilitation is the efficient management of (customs, immigration, health and quarantine) border control processes, to expedite clearance (of aircraft, passengers/crew, baggage and cargo) and to prevent unnecessary delays

- Maintain stability of supply chain
- Support economic growth
- Enable sustainable development of air transport
- Maintain security and flight safety

Annex 9 to the Chicago Convention

- facilitation of landside formalities for clearance of aircraft, passengers, goods and mail
 - requirements of customs, immigration, public health and agriculture authorities

ICAO and the UN Security Council

Agreement between the United Nations and the International Civil Aviation Organization (13 May 1947)

Article VII: Assistance to the Security Council

The International Civil Aviation Organization agrees to co-operate with the Economic and Social Council in furnishing such information and rendering such assistance to the Security Council as that Council may request, including assistance in carrying out decisions of the Security Council for the maintenance or restoration of international peace and security


UNSC Resolution 2178 (2014)

- "Reaffirms that all States shall prevent the movement of terrorists or terrorist groups by effective border controls and controls on issuance of identity papers and travel documents, and through measures for preventing counterfeiting, forgery or fraudulent use of identity papers and travel documents..."
- "9. Calls upon Member States to require that airlines operating in their territories provide advance passenger information (API) to the appropriate national authorities in order to detect the departure from their territories, or attempted entry into or transit through their territories, by means of civil aircraft, of individuals designated by the Committee established pursuant to resolutions 1267 (1999) and 1989 (2011)..."


UNSC Resolution 2309 (2016)

During a ministerial meeting held on 22 September 1016, on countering the ongoing danger posed by terrorism to civil aviation, the Security Council this morning called on all States to work with each other and the International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO) to continuously adapt measures to meet that "ever-evolving global threat".

Aviation Security Policy

- Aviation Security Panel (AVSECP/27) Montréal, 14 to 18 March 2016
 - Implications of MH17, Germanwings 9525, Metrojet 9268 and Daallo Airlines 159
 - Emerging risks areas (cybersecurity, RPAS)
 - Proposed Amendment 15 to Annex 17 Security
 - Transition of the ICASS into a Global Aviation Security Plan (GASeP)

Aviation Security Policy (cont'd)

- Proposed amendment 15 to Annex 17 Security
 - Presented to Council for adoption during its 209th Session in November 2016
 - Envisaged to become applicable in July 2017
 - New/reviewed provisions on behavioural detection, innovation in aviation security, Man-Portable Air Defence Systems (MANPADS), risk assessments, cybersecurity and landside security
 - Existing recommended Practices on landside security will be elevated to Standards
 - Reminder: comments on State letter AS 8/2.1-16/58 had to reach the Secretariat by 9 September 2016

Aviation Security Policy (cont'd)

- Outcomes of the 39th Session of the ICAO Assembly
 - Consolidated Statement on Continuing ICAO Policies Related to Aviation Security adopted as Resolution A39-18
 - Resolution A39-19 reflects a cross-cutting, horizontal approach on Addressing Cybersecurity in Civil Aviation
 - ICASS extended until GASeP approval for implementation; request for an accelerated development of GASeP


Aviation Security Policy

- Outcomes of the 39th Session of the ICAO Assembly (cont'd)
 - Resolution A39-38 on the Comprehensive Regional Implementation Plan for Aviation Security and Facilitation in Africa
 - broad support of the recent United Nations (UN) Security Council Resolution 2309 (2016), on Aviation Security

USAP-CMA

- Activities to date (15 October 2016)
 - 45 audits
 - 3 validation missions to evaluate the resolution of Significant Security Concerns (SSeCs)
 - 5 audits planned in the remainder of 2016
 - AFI Region: 12 States audited under the USAP-CMA so far

Assistance

- 21 States are actively engaged in the implementation of an Aviation Security Implementation Plan (ASIP), including 11 States in the AFI Region
- ASIPs completed in 7 African States
- 4 ASIPs on hold
- In addition: 9 States provided with direct assistance

 - Support to various regional aviation security (AVSEC) initiatives
 - Comprehensive Regional Implementation Plan for Aviation Security and Facilitation in Africa (AFI SECFAL Plan)
 - Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with Airports Council International (ACI)
 - Airport Excellence (APEX) in Security Programme (23/02/2016)

- Training
 - 31 Aviation Security Training Centres (ASTCs); recently endorsed:
 - Dublin International Aviation Training Academy (Ireland)
 - Jeddah Saudi Academy of Civil Aviation (Saudi Arabia)
 - 2015: 40 ICAO-sponsored training events offered throughout the ASTC network
 - 521 AVSEC personnel /105 States
 - As of 30 September 2016, 27 training events offered throughout the ASTC network
 - 392 AVSEC personnel / 77 States

- Training (Cont'd)
 - Redevelopment of the ICAO AVSEC Instructors certification process:
 - Two-phase blended approach
 - Re-certification process for the existing cadre of ICAO Aviation Security Instructors:
 - new on-line platform
 - "official" continued endorsement from the State's appropriate authority required.
 - Validity of certification: 3 years


Traveller identification (TRIP) strategy

Holistic approach to identification management









Moving Air Cargo Globally

The purpose of this publication is to promote awareness of the air cargo and mail supply chain, with on emphasis on the related security and facilitation procedures developed by the international Chil Awateon Organization (CAO), the World Customs Organization (WCO), the Universital Postal Union (UPU) and also the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (UNIXCC).

The intent is to provide a better understanding of supply chain security for those who work in the cargo field, and more broadly, anyone who might benefit from knowing more about international air cargo and mail security standards.

This document familiarizes readers with the roles and responsibilities of all entities involved in the transport of cargo and mail by air. It covers the various operational aspects, security factors, facilitation processes and documentation of that supply chain.

The reader will gain an understanding of the applicable regulatory frameworks and efforts made by International Organizations and their members to support information sharing and continued development of a secure size conditional industry. These provisions and activities enhance the movement of goods by promoting effective end-to-end supply chain security.

One of 3 interrelated pillars of Facilitation



Recommended Practice (RP) 3.9.1: "Contracting States issuing, or intending to **issue** eMRTDs **should join** the ICAO Public Key Directory (PKD) and upload their information to the PKD."

RP 3.9.2: "Contracting States implementing **checks** on eMRTDs at border controls **should join** the ICAO Public Key Directory (PKD) and **use** the information available from the **PKD** to **validate** eMRTDs at border controls."



Acts of Unlawful Interference Database (AUID)




The AUID is a secure online database available to all Member States, designed to disseminate information on aviation security incidents in an efficient and effective manner

-- Graphical and numerical display of AUI data --


ICAO Point of Contact Network (AVSECNET)
