#### REVIEW OF THE CONCLUSIONS AND DECISIONS FROM DGCA/5

(Presented by the Secretariat)

#### **SUMMARY**

This paper provides a status report on the implementation of the main Conclusions of the DGCA/5 Meeting held in Dakar, Senegal, 4 November 2013).

#### 1. INTRODUCTION

1.1 The Fifth Meeting of Directors General of Civil Aviation of the Eastern & Southern and Western & Central African States, was held in Dakar, Senegal on 4th November 2013. It was attended by eighty three (83) delegates from twenty eight (28) Contracting States and eleven (11) international and regional organizations.

## 2. DISCUSSION

- 2.1. The main outcomes of the DGCA/5 meeting covered the following:
  - a) Follow up actions on the outstanding conclusions of previous DGCA meetings;
  - b) Commitment of DGCAs to facilitate and support the implementation of the conclusions of APIRG/19 and RASG-AFI/2 meetings, which are aimed at enhancing the efficiency and safety of the aviation system in the AFI Region; and;
  - c) States' responsibility to establish action plans to reduce CO<sub>2</sub> emissions; and
  - d) Implementation of Aviation Security Assistance and Capacity Building Strategy centered on the development of State Improvement Plans (SIPs); and States' accountability in the planning, delivery and reporting of the assistance provided under this programme.
- 2.2. The status of implementation of DGCA/5 meeting's conclusions is provided at **Appendix** to this working paper.
- 2.3. The meeting may wish to note that, in the absence of a follow mechanism, it has always been a challenge to establish an accurate status of implementation of the conclusions of DGCA meetings, against the performance targets and deadlines set by the DGCAs for the implementation of their conclusions by States, the ICAO Secretariat and other aviation stakeholders.
- 2.4. However, it is to be pointed out that a considerable number of such conclusions are related to the

work being carried out by existing regional mechanisms, including the APIRG and RASG-AFI. The status of implementation of APIRG and RASG-AFI conclusions will be provided under Agenda Items 2 and 3 of this meeting.

- 2.5. It is to be noted that most of the safety related conclusions are addressed under the regional safety targets adopted by the Ministerial Conference held in Abuja in July 2012. These targets are aligned with the ICAO Global Aviation Safety Plan (GASP). Concerning air navigation related conclusions, the regional ASBU Plan which is aligned with Global Air Navigation Plan (GANP), provides an appropriate framework for DGCAs to monitor the performance targets set up by the APIRG. In this regard, the DGCAs are requested to develop their national ASBU Plans, including PBN plans as applicable, and ensure implementation of the regional air navigation requirements.
- 2.6. With respect to the GASP and GANP requirement for regional annual reporting, the RASG-AFI has released two Annual Safety Reports since the last DGCA meeting, in May 2015 and June 2016 respectively. The DGCAs are requested to support the development of the First APIRG Annual Report in 2017.
- 2.7. As far as Aviation Security and Facilitation (AVSEC/FAL) related conclusions are concerned, implementation activities have mainly continued to be addressed through State Improvement Plans (SIPs) now ASIPs and incorporated in the work programme of the AFI SECFAL Plan, which was launched as an ICAO programme in May 2015.
- 2.8. Concerning Environmental Protection, ICAO is offering partnership agreements under its Buddy Programme, to assist States in establishing and implementation action plans for CO<sub>2</sub> emission reduction. A number of States have developed action plans for CO<sub>2</sub> emissions reduction from international civil aviation, with the assistance of the on-going ICAO/EU Assistance Project on capacity building for CO<sub>2</sub> mitigation.

### 3. ACTION BY THE MEETING

- 3.1 The meeting is invited to:
  - a) Note the status of implementation of DGCA/5 conclusions as summarized in **Appendix** to this working paper, and provide updates as required;
  - b) Agree to establish a follow up mechanism to ensure that DGCA meetings conclusions are implemented by States and stakeholders in a timely manner;
  - c) Request DGCAs to provide feedback on the status of implementation of to facilitate the monitoring and reporting process.
