Restrictions promulgated by States

- On 11/03/2020, the Director-General of WHO declared the outbreak of COVID-19 a pandemic.
- All Africa States affected
- Several restrictions NOTAMS issued
- States to review NOTAMS to ensure their updates along the resumption of flights
- COVID-19 NOTAMS can be accessed through ICAO API Data Service

Globally harmonized measures

- Aviation safety-related measures
 - States may temporarily depart from ICAO Standards but must do so in a manner that does not compromise safety and security, and which is duly reported to ICAO. These departures should not be retained beyond the crisis.

- Aviation public health-related measures
 - States should establish public health procedures aligned with the guidance included in the annexed document, *Take-off: Guidance for Air Travel through the COVID-19 Public Health Crisis*. The necessity of these measures should be regularly reviewed. The measures which are no longer relevant should be discontinued when the need for their application has ceased to exist.

Globally harmonized measures

- Security- and facilitation-related measures
 - States should enhance cross-sectoral coordination by establishing a National Air Transport Facilitation Committee or equivalent, and systematically use the Passenger Health Locator Form as a reference. It is States' responsibility to maintain security across all operations.

Economic and financial measures

 These should be inclusive, targeted, proportionate, transparent, temporary and consistent with ICAO's policies, while striking an appropriate balance of interests without prejudice to fair competition.

Due to the urgent need to reduce the risks related to the COVID -19 pandemic by air transport and as a result of social distancing practices, closure of workspaces and other public health intervention measures, a number of States are taking various actions to enable service providers and personnel to maintain the validity of their certificates, licenses, and other approvals during the COVID-19 pandemic.

This web site provides guidance for States to be flexible in their approaches while at the same time adhering to their obligations under the Convention on International Civil Aviation (Doc 7300, Chicago Convention).

All States are encouraged to make use of this website and inform ICAO of any developments in their State using the information highlighted on the site, which will be maintained by ICAO through 31 March 2021 unless circumstances otherwise dictate

Aviation safety-related measures

Quick Reference Guides (QRG)

- Developed by ICAO to provide guidance of a particular subject area in addressing COVID-19 related risks to the continuity of business and operations that might be under consideration by a State for alleviations, while ensuring that the safety risks introduced by any changes from alleviations are also addressed.
- These may be for areas which will require the filing of a temporary difference using the COVID-19 Contingency Related Difference (CCRD) tool, or may refer to areas, such as training, where the State has the authority to allow for exemptions, and extensions without needing to notify ICAO.


ATCO training alleviation as a consequence of COVID-19 spread v1.1

Air Traffic Management (ATM)

• Includes information and guidance to support collaboration decision making (CDM) between all ATM stakeholders at national, regional, and inter-regional levels for the effective coordination and management of traffic during the disruption caused by the COVID-19 pandemic. The implementation of this guidance is expected to provide for a smooth and less challenging return to normal operations.



 Provides guidance on the review of potential hazards associated with recovery to normal air traffic services (ATS) following disruption resulting from the COVID-19 pandemic, to support ATS providers in their safety risk assessment processes.





COVID-19 RESPONSE AND RECOVERY IMPLEMENTATION CENTER

The Civil Aveilon Recovery Task Force (CART) report and the attached Talks off guidence document were approved on 1st June 2020 by the ICAO Council. The report contains among others, 11 recommendations advised and Member States.

The report mentions that the level of imprementation of the measures contained therein will need to be regularly monitored by KCAD, in playing this role, KCAD will facilitate the sharing of information and expensesce among States and should facilitate the identification of gaps and needed support.

Through the information ICIO will be delice to provide agrosperie, brighted and fitney guidance, training and assistance its Member States, many by means of enginementation packages, for the effective enginementation of measures cultimated in the report. To support States in implementing the measures and recommendations contained in the CART Report, and to help invoide progress in implementation by States, it is proposed to create a "COVIC-15 Response and Recovery implementation Center".

Global Implementation Roadmap

- The GIR identifies outcome-driven activities and initiatives undertaken by ICAO, ranging from implementation support and coordination to monitoring and reporting:
 - Implementation support activities focus on providing guidance, training tools and expert assistance to States in line with the CART recommendations;
 - Coordination activities aim to enhance cooperation and synergies between ICAO, States, regional organizations and commissions, industry stakeholders and the World Health Organization (WHO) and other United Nations (UN) entities to avoid duplication of efforts in implementing the CART recommendations and guidance;
 - Monitoring and reporting activities are facilitated through multi-functional interactive tools available in the CRRIC, including a gap analysis tool, a database of risk mitigation measures as well as an information-sharing tool

Implementation Package (iPACK)

- An Implementation Package (iPACK) is a self contained package composed of the relevant:
 - guidance material, including ICAO Annexes, Documents, Circulars, best practices papers or other associated guidance material;
 - standardized training, including standardized and competency based trainings, in classroom, online or virtual formats;
 - tools, including data driven application, online reporting systems, electronic management systems or questionnaire/surveys;
 - subject matter expertise, including the provision of experts to support field operations; and
 - guidance for procurement, with regards to the purchase of infrastructure or equipment.

- To support the implementation of the CART Recommendations, ICAO has created the COVID-19 Response and Recovery Implementation Centre (CRRIC).
- The CRRIC will assist states to monitor, document, and report their progress in the implementation of the CART recommendations
- Each Member State to designate a 'national focal point' for the CRRIC
