PART I – INTRODUCTION

1.1 VENUE, DATE AND ATTENDANCE

1.1.1 The 25th meeting of the Comprehensive Regional Implementation Plan for Aviation Safety in Africa Steering Committee (AFI Plan SC/25) was held on 17 and 18 May 2022 in Abuja, Nigeria, as part of the seventh AFI Aviation week. Over 200 participants including delegations from States, the ICAO Council and the Air Navigation Commission (ANC), Officials of invited regional organizations, industry and other partners and stakeholders attended the meeting. The list of participants is provided in **Attachment D** to this report.

1.2 OPENING OF THE MEETING

- 1.2.1 The Meeting was opened during the grand opening session of the 7th AFI Week events. The AFI Week was addressed and opened by Senator Hadi Abubakar Sirika, Minister for Aviation of the Federal Republic of Nigeria, the ICAO Secretary General Mr. Juan Carlos Salazar, the African Union (AU) Commissioner for Infrastructure and Energy represented by Mr. Eric Ntagengerwa, the African Civil Aviation Commission (AFCAC) Interim Secretary General, Ms. Angeline Simana, and Captain Musa Shuaibu Nuhu, Director General of the Nigeria Civil Aviation Authority. The Chairperson of the AFI Plan Steering Committee Mr. Levers Mabaso chaired and presided over the proceedings of the AFI Plan SC meeting.
- 1.2.2 The Director General of the Nigeria Civil Aviation Authority (NCAA) welcomed the delegates to the AFI Week, while the AFCAC Interim Secretary General thanked the Government of the Federal Republic of Nigeria and ICAO for hosting the AFI Week. Ms. Simana applauded the ICAO Secretary General for his commitment and support to the AFI region as she outlined some key priorities of AFCAC for its 2022 triennium. AFCAC recognised and appreciated in a special way, continued support from key partners such as the Republic of Singapore, the African Development Bank (AfDB) and European Union (EU) among others.

- 1.2.3 The AU Commissioner appreciated the invitation to the 7th Aviation Week, describing it as an opportunity to share experiences and challenges affecting the restart and recovery of air transport forging for measures to build a favourable regulatory environment in support of a sustainable recovery of the African air transport sector. Dr. Amani commended the partnership established during the devastating and unprecedented challenges due to COVID-19 pandemic highlighting that the AU Task Force is working on harmonizing the existing digital platforms for traveller health credentials and border requirements. She urged Governments to continue providing timely and accurate updates on health protocols and provide information on digital COVID-19 vaccination certificates.
- 1.2.4 The Senior Minister of State for Sustainability and Environment for the Republic of Singapore, Dr. Amy Khor, on her part appreciated and thanked for the invitation extended to Singapore to attend this important meeting. She expressed that the key strategic role of the AFI Plan and AFI SECFAL programmes in supporting the Continent and pledged the support of her Government to this plans a cash and in-kind support amounts USD 100,000.00. In addition to that a Memorandum of Understanding between the Government of Singapore and the African Civil Aviation Commission (AFCAC) on capacity building was signed during the opening session.
- 1.2.5 In his opening remarks, the ICAO Secretary General expressed his special gratitude to the Federal Republic of Nigeria for accepting to host the AFI Week events. The Secretary General mentioned that this was a demonstration of the State's commitment towards strengthening of civil aviation on the continent, putting Covid-19 pandemic behind and reconnecting the world. Mr. Salazar further highlighted the AFI Plan achievements and key progresses made in implementing the programme despite the challenges paused by COVID 19. He urged all African States and relevant organizations to attend the 41st Assembly later this year and encouraged active participation at the upcoming High-level meeting on States' Long-term Aspirational emissions Goal (LTAG) from 20 to 22 July 2022.

- 1.2.6 As he opened the 7th AFI Aviation week, Senator Hadi Abubakar Sirika, Honourable Minister of Aviation of the Federal Republic of Nigeria thanked ICAO as well as the coordinators of the AFI Plan and AFI SECFAL Plan for sustaining these initiatives over the years, which have contributed to the improvement of safety, security and facilitation in the region. He appealed Member States, AFCAC and the ICAO Secretary General to revive the ICAO Human Resource Development Fund (HRDF) programme. The Minister ensured Nigeria commitment to continue to support ICAO's initiatives, and collaborate with Member States as well as partners on the development of air transport industry in Africa.
- 1.2.7 The Chairperson of the AFI Plan SC, Mr. Levers Mabaso, in his remarks thanked the ICAO Secretary General and his staff for the continued commitment and support provided in the effective implementation of the AFI Plan Work Programmes, which has yielded a positive impact on aviation safety in Africa.
- 1.2.8 Mr. Levers expressed appreciation for the participation and support of African States, the ICAO Council Members and State Representatives to ICAO and all partners present; and requested for their continued commitment to the improvement of Aviation Safety in Africa. He finally strongly encouraged participants to actively contribute to the deliberations, and express their challenges, which will facilitate the support provided.

2.1 ADOPTION OF THE AGENDA

2.1.1 The meeting reviewed and adopted the provisional agenda and work programme presented by the AFI Plan Secretariat, as shown below:

2.2 DELIBERATIONS ON THE AGENDA

- 2.2.1 AGENDA ITEM 1: Follow up actions on the Decisions and Recommendations of the 24th AFI Plan Steering Committee meeting & Status of the Implementation of the 2021 AFI Plan Work Programme.
- 2.2.1.1 The AFI Plan Secretariat presented Discussion Paper 01 and its attachments (A and B) providing detailed information on the implementation status of the Recommendations and Decisions of the 24th SC meeting held on 15 July 2021 virtually and the 2021 work programme respectively.
- 2.2.1.2 The attention of the meeting was drawn to the following specific issues:
 - The development of a Strategic Plan for supporting and strengthening Regional Safety Oversight Organizations (RSOOs) in Africa;
 - The virtual and online support to States through ROST despite the COVID-19 situation and the resumption of onsite support in 2022;

- The support provided by partners and stakeholders towards attainment of some of the AFI Plan targets;
- The virtual and online training provided to the Least Developed Countries (LDCs) including Increased Access to Training (IaT) for States with poor internet access, in collaboration with GAT;
- The AFI plan projects update based on the Decisions of the 24th meeting of the AFI SC (AFI Plan SC/24);
- The continuous positive high-level support and engagement made by the ICAO Secretary General and the President of the ICAO Council to enhance aviation safety in the region;
- The specific request made for assistance from States (Burundi and Guinea); and
- The support and guidance provided for the Association of African Aviation
 Training Organizations (AATO) in its organizational sustainability effort.

DECISIONS (DEC) AND RECOMMENDATIONS (REC) ON AGENDA ITEM 1

SC25/Dec 01: ROST Activities

The Steering Committee requested that the Regional Office Safety Team (ROST) and AFI-CIS missions be prioritized in accordance with the needs of States to further assist States in the implementation on their USOAP CMA Corrective Action Plans (CAPs); and specifically, to address the remaining SSC; and improve EIs in low performing States.

SC25/Dec 02: Aviation Professionals Capacity building

Based on the results of the AFI Plan aviation professionals' capacity study, and the needs analysis, the Steering Committee requested the AFI Plan to continue provision of targeted Safety-related trainings in coordination with ICAO Global Aviation Training (GAT) Office, workshops and seminars including virtually towards enhancing the implementation capacity of States.

SC25/Rec 03: Abuja Safety Targets

The Steering Committee recommended AFCAC to coordinate with the RSOOs to improve data collection and access to aviation data from African States; and closely work with Rwanda on the proposed support and come up with a digital dashboard for continuous monitoring the level of implementation of regional targets.

SC25/Rec 04: High-level support in addressing States' aviation safety deficiencies

The Steering Committee encouraged the ICAO Council President and the Secretary General, especially during visits and regional meetings, to continue to engage at the highest level Authorities of those States that are not cooperating with ICAO and/or sufficiently advancing in addressing their aviation safety deficiencies.

SC25/Rec 05: Aviation Infrastructure Gap Analysis

The Steering Committee recommended that, in collaboration with AUC, AFCAC and other partners, the AFI Plan Secretariat continue to follow up on the recommendations from the Aviation Infrastructure for Africa Gap analysis conducted in 2019 and give priority to infrastructure development in Africa.

SC25/Dec 06: Partners capacity building support

The Steering Committee recommended that the AFI Plan Secretariat and AFCAC coordinate on matters related to the capacity building of aviation professionals, leveraging on the AFCAC - Singapore MOU signed on 16 May 2022, in order to avoid duplication of efforts.

- 2.2.2 AGENDA ITEM 2: Review and approval of the revised AFI Plan Projects;

 Continuation of the AFI Plan; and 2022 AFI Plan work Programme and

 Budget
- 2.2.2.1 Under this agenda item the Secretariat presented Discussion Paper 02-A comprising the revised project documents for the continuation of the implementation of the Aerodrome Certification, Air Navigation Service Provider (ANSP) Peer Review, State Safety Programme (SSP) Implementation; fundamentals of safety oversight (FSO) and aeronautical information management (AIM) projects with associated costs of implementation 729,747 USD. The details of the revised projects are presented as Attachment B to this report.
- 2.2.2.2 The Secretariat also presented Discussion Paper 02 -B under agenda item no.2 on the implementation and achievements of the AFI Plan since inception. In this paper it is also highlighted the need for the continuation of the AFI Plan beyond 2024 in an effective and systematic manner in all safety and air navigation capacity and efficiency related areas, and in full alignment with the ICAO Global Aviation Safety Plan (GASP) and the Global Air Navigation Plan (GANP). This will contribute to accelerating the efforts being made by African States to achieve the goals and targets set by these global Plans.

- 2.2.2.3 The Secretariat also presented Discussion Paper 02 -B under agenda item no.2 on the implementation and achievements of the AFI Plan since inception. In this paper it is also highlighted the need for the continuation of the AFI Plan beyond 2024 in an effective and systematic manner in all safety and air navigation capacity and efficiency related areas, and in full alignment with the ICAO Global Aviation Safety Plan (GASP) and the Global Air Navigation Plan (GANP). This will contribute to accelerating the efforts being made by African States to achieve the goals and targets set by these global Plans.
- 2.2.2.4 The discussion paper 03 presented under this agenda item proposed work programme and budget of the AFI Plan for the year 2022. The programme was developed considering the status of implementation in 2021 and the initiatives and targets set for 2022, taking into consideration the updated Programme Document of the AFI Plan for 2021-2024 and the revised project documents proposed to this Steering Committee meeting in the discussion paper 02-A indicated under section 4.2.1 of this report. The key activities and budget of the 2022 presented as Attachment-C to this report.
- 2.2.2.5 The Steering Committee meeting took note of the following:
 - The objective, scope and required budget of the updated project document;
 - The significant contribution made by the AFI Plan programme activities in aviation safety in Africa;
 - The critical importance and relevance of the AFI Plan work programmes in the Region for the coming years;
 - The recommendations of the 2015 Programme evaluation and the current ongoing evaluation of the Plan;
 - The information provided in the 2022 AFI Plan work programme activities and associated budget;
 - The challenge that the programme faced to effectively implement its programme due to COVID 19; and

• The efforts made by the ICAO Regional Offices to engage States virtually and online during the period.

DECISIONS (DEC) AND RECOMMENDATION (REC) ON AGENDA ITEM 2

SC25/Dec 07: Implementation of the AFI Plan Projects

The Steering Committee:

- a) Approved the Revised projects presented and its budget for 2022.
 Implementation activities of the project should be presented for each year including the required budget subject to availability of funds;
 and
- b) Called on States, international and regional organizations, financing institutions; and industry to support the AFI Plan implementation assistance projects.

SC25/Dec 08: Continuation of the AFI Plan

The Steering Committee:

- a) Supported the continuation of AFI Plan activities beyond 2024 as part of the work programme of the ICAO Regional Offices, covering all safety and air navigation capacity and efficiency related areas, including aviation infrastructure planning;
- b) Called on States, international and regional organizations, financing institutions, and industry to continue supporting the programme.
- c) Recommended that the ICAO Secretariat to consider scheduling USOAP activities for the States supported by the Plan to assist in evaluating its relevance and the results achieved through the assistance provided.; and
- d) Recommended the ICAO Secretariat to develop a related working paper for the 41st Session of the ICAO Assembly, in accordance with Resolution A38-7 on the AFI Plan.

SC25/Dec 09: 2022 Work Programme

The Steering Committee approved the proposed 2022 AFI Plan Work Programme and budget as presented by the Secretariat.

2.2.3 AGENDA ITEM 3: Implementation status of the revised Abuja Safety Targets and Air Navigation Services Performance Indicators

- 2.2.3.1 AFCAC presented DP 04 and provided information on the status of implementation of the revised Abuja Safety targets and ANS Performances Indicators. The meeting also provided on the status of implementation of the AFI Cooperative Inspectorate Scheme (CIS).
- 2.2.3.2 AFCAC has developed a monitoring mechanism to gather and analyze information from member States. The report presented to the Steering Committee was based on information gathered from States and supplemented by relevant information from ICAO databases and industry partners. However, it was noted that there is a need to improve on the scope and quality of the information provided.

DECISION (DEC) AND RECOMMENDATIONS (REC) ON AGENDA ITEM 3

SC25/Rec 10: Monitoring implementation of the Abuja Safety Targets incorporating Air Navigation Services Targets

The Steering Committee noted the information provided and requested AFCAC to:

a) Convene a meeting to evaluate the relevance of the Abuja safety targets incorporating air navigation targets, in view of the evolution of the ICAO GASP and GANP objectives, goals and targets, in collaboration with ICAO

Regional Offices and other key partners;

b) Review the implementation modalities of the AFI-CIS in collaboration with key partners; and

c) Give enough attention and priority to low-level implementation areas such as AIG, ANS and AGA, in the deployment of AFI CIS support strategy and actions.

2.2.4 AGENDA ITEM 4: Presentation and Launch of the 8th RASG-AFI Annual Safety Report

2.2.4.1 The Regional Aviation Safety Group for Africa-Indian Ocean (RASG-AFI) Annual Safety Report Team (ASRT) has consistently performed its task to produce an annual report on aviation safety in the RASG-AFI Region. The report provides safety information from consolidated sources to determine the main safety risks in the Region and generate recommendations to the RASG-AFI for formulation of safety enhancement initiatives.

2.2.4.2 The eighth RASG AFI annual Safety report therefore prepared in the above context and officially released during this AFI Plan Steering Committee meeting.

DECISION (DEC) AND RECOMMENDATIONS (REC) ON AGENDA ITEM 4

SC25 /Dec 11: RASG-AFI Annual Safety Report

The Steering Committee commended the RASG-AFI Aviation Safety Report Team that has been producing the annual report consistently; and encouraged the ICAO Regional Offices to continue to coordinate the publishing of the safety information annually.

2.2.5 AGENDA ITEM 5: Review and approval of the RSOO study recommendations, strategy, and roadmap; and Status report on the Aviation Professionals study

- 2.2.5.1 Under this agenda item, the Secretariat presented the study conducted on Regional Safety Oversight Organizations (RSOOs) in the AFI Region, in line with the Ministerial Declaration and subsequent decisions of the AFI Plan SC meetings. The key purpose of the study was to identify actions necessary for ensuring the effectiveness, efficiency and sustainability of the RSOOs and develop a Strategic Plan and Roadmap for implementation.
- 2.2.5.2 The RSOO study evaluated the impact of AFI RSOOs in improving the safety oversight standards of States and their effectiveness and efficiency. It covered and considered establishment and membership of the RSOOs, funding arrangements, autonomy and independences, technical capacity and qualification of technical personnel, delegation of functions and activities, and cooperation and collaboration in safety oversight and accident investigation.
- 2.2.5.3 The other discussion paper presented under this agenda item by the Secretariat is on the progress made in the conduct of the Aviation Professionals study. As part of the initial activities, a survey on current staff levels and gaps within the AFI region was carried out. The Secretariat informed the meeting of the main results of the preliminary analysis of the survey responses and the ongoing related activities, for the completion of the study.
- 2.2.5.4 The Steering Committee meeting took note of the following:
 - The 2017 Ezulwini Declaration on Regional Safety Oversight Organizations (RSOOs) in Africa;
 - Subsequent guidance provided by the SC of AFI Plan on the development of a Strategic Plan for supporting and strengthening Regional Safety Oversight Organizations (RSOOs) in Africa;
 - The AFI RSOO study conducted and presented to States and partners during a validation workshop in November 2021;
 - The progress made so far in the conduct of the Aviation Professionals study;
 - The results of the preliminary analysis of the survey responses and the ongoing related activities of the Aviation Professionals study; and

• The challenge in obtaining enough information.

DECISION (DEC) AND RECOMMENDATION(REC) ON AGENDA ITEM 5

SC25 /Dec 12: RSOO study Recommendations and Strategy

The Steering Committee recommended that, in collaboration with the AUC, AFCAC, EASA and other key Partners:

- a) ICAO in collaboration with the AUC, AFCAC, EASA and other key Partners to organize a Regional Forum as a follow up of the Ezulwini Declaration of March 2017 to establish continental common understanding and synergy on the implementation of the AFI RSOOs Strategic Plan; and
- b) Present the reviewed AFI RSOOs study recommendations, Strategic Plan and Implementation Roadmap including the outcomes of the High-level Forum, to African Ministers responsible for Civil Aviation for their consideration.

SC25 /Dec 13: Aviation Professionals study in Africa

The Steering Committee noted the progress made in the conduct of the study on Aviation Professionals in Africa, and requested the Secretariat to finalize the study and present the results of the study to the next AFI Plan SC meeting.

2.2.6 AGENDA ITEM 6: Presentations by Partners

European Aviation Safety Agency (EASA)

2.2.6.1 EASA made a presentation on its activities in the Region and the support provided enabling States to establish and maintain an effective and sustainable safety oversight system, strengthening the Regional Organizations (ROs) and assisting AFCAC to continue with the implementation of AFI CIS in support of its member States. In addition to Safety, EASA indicated that the support focus encompasses other areas of aviation such as environment, cyber security and SAATM.

2.2.6.2 The Steering Committee noted the information and expressed its appreciation for the continued support provided by the EASA to improve aviation safety in Africa.

International Air Transport Association (IATA)

2.2.6.3 IATA made a presentation on its initiatives aimed to achieve reduced operational risk, support consistent implementation of safety management system and address identified emerging/evolving safety issues. These initiatives support the achievement of the ICAO Global Aviation Safety Plan (GASP) goals within the timeline set in the plan.

The Association of the African Aviation Training Organization (AATO)

2.2.6.4 The Association of African Aviation Training Organizations (AATO) presented the critical organizational challenges being experienced to run its operation sustainably. Accordingly, AATO made an appeal to the AFI Plan and AFI SECFAL Steering Committees and partners to support its programmes including the implementation of its African Aviation Training Roadmap.

DECISION AND RECOMMENDATION (REC) ON AGENDA ITEM 6

SC22/Rec 14: Programmes / Activities of aviation safety partners in Africa

The meeting recognized and commended the various support activities made by EASA and IATA as well as other partners and encouraged all partners to continue their valuable contributions in key priority areas through the existing collaborative framework with the AFI Plan to continuously improve aviation safety in Africa.

SC25/Dec 15: Sustainability of AATO

The Steering Committee requested:

- a) AATO to develop a project in collaboration the AFI Plan and AFI SECFAL Plan Secretariat, for consideration by the Steering Committees of the two programmes;
- b) AFI Plan Secretariat to look into various options for the sustainability of the AATO to maintain its relevance and continue to deliver on its assigned

objectives, in collaboration with AFCAC and other partners.

2.3 CLOSING OF THE MEETING

2.3.1 In closing the meeting, the AFI Plan Chairperson expressed his appreciation to all participants for their active participation and acknowledged the sound deliberations that took place and the important Decisions and Recommendations of the meeting for future actions. He finally expressed gratitude for the continued support and assistance that the Programme obtained from the donor States and Organizations.
