Recent Vocanic Eruptions

Volcano	Eruption Dates	Impacts
Eyjafjöll (Iceland)	April 2010	Severely disrupted air traffic in Europe and the North Atlantic,
		grounding flights for days
Mount Cameroon	Last eruption: 2012	 Minor infrastructure damage (trails, plantations)
(Cameroon)		
Mount Nyiragongo	May 22–30, 2021	• 32–37 deaths and ~400,000 displaced
(DR Congo)		 Destruction included over 3,500 homes, schools, health
		clinics, power network, etc.
		• SO₂ emissions and ash triggered respiratory issues
Mount Marapi	December 3, 2023, initial	• 24 killed, 12 injured
(Indonesia)	event; activity continued into	Forced airport closures including Minangkabau
	early 2024	International Airport
Kanlaon Volcano	June 3, 2024 – still active	 Over 57,000 people affected in June 2024;
(Philippines)	(latest in May 13, 2025)	 Nearly 4,000 displaced;
		 ~\$3 million in damage to agriculture and homes
Mount Etna (Sicily,	June 2, 2025	 No injuries reported;
Italy)		 But local roads and tourist trails were disrupted;
		Ash prompted flight delays
