The Carbon Offsetting and Reduction Scheme for International Aviation (CORSIA) is the first global market-based scheme that applies to a sector, and complements other aviation in-sector emissions reductions efforts such as technological innovations, operational improvements and sustainable fuels to meet ICAO aspirational goal of carbon neutral growth.

Under CORSIA, all States that have aeroplane operators that perform international flights are required to monitor, report and verify (MRV) CO_2 emissions from these flights every year from 2019. In addition to annual CO_2 MRV, 88 States have volunteered to participate in offsetting CO_2 emissions under CORSIA from its pilot phase starting in 2021.


Navigating CORSIA — A guide to the scheme's design and implementation

Since the adoption of the CORSIA-related Standards and Recommended Practices (SARPs) in 2018, ICAO has developed the remaining elements needed for the CORSIA implementation. 
CORSIA in Numbers (As of 30 November 2020)



CORSIA Eligible Fuels

The ICAO Council approved two Sustainability Certification Schemes (International Sustainability and Carbon Certification and Roundtable on Sustainable Biomaterials) as eligible to certify the sustainability and life-cycle emissions values of CORSIA eligible fuels. CORSIA Eligible Emissions Units

Following the recommendations of the Technical Advisory Body (TAB), the ICAO Council approved one more programme (Architecture for REDD+ Transactions) to supply CORSIA eligible emissions units for compliance use in the pilot phase, bringing the total number of approved programmes to seven. The Council also approved changes in the scope of eligibility for four previously approved programmes. CORSIA Capacity Building

ACT-CORSIA: The Assistance, Capacity Building and Training programme on CORSIA, established in June 2018, encompasses the CORSIA Buddy Partnerships, and all ICAO outreach initiatives including sample model regulations for CORSIA, frequently asked questions (FAQs), brochures, leaflets, videos as well as CORSIA seminars/webinars and online tutorials.

ACT-CORSIA Buddy Partnerships: The core of capacity building relies on individual training of CORSIA Focal Points and involves experts from a total of 131 States. In November 2020, Angola, Mozambique and Sao Tome and Principe were supported bringing the total number of supported States under Phase III to 58. More information can be found here.
