

## THIRD ICAO AVIATION SAFETY IMPLEMENTATION ASSISTANCE PARTNERSHIP (ASIAP) MEETING

#### Montréal, Canada, 12 December 2017

#### **REPORT**

#### 1. **INTRODUCTION**

- 1.1 The Third ICAO Aviation Safety Implementation Assistance Partnership (ASIAP) meeting was held at ICAO Headquarters in Montréal, Canada, on 12 December as a side meeting of the Safety and Air Navigation Implementation Symposium (SANIS) and was attended by 34 participants (Appendix A). The Russian Federation, South Africa, Airbus, and CANSO sent their regrets due to other commitments.
- 1.2 The objective of the ASIAP meeting is for ASIAP partners to discuss their technical assistance activities and to explore possibilities to collaborate on assistance efforts in ASIAP Priority States.

#### 2. SUMMARY OF MEETING DISCUSSIONS

## 2.1 **Opening of the Meeting**

- a) The meeting was opened by the Deputy Director, Aviation Safety, of the ICAO Air Navigation Bureau. He highlighted the importance of ASIAP for enhancing the implementation of the GASP by providing assistance. He also emphasized the need for all the ASIAP partners to take a more active role.
- b) The representatives of Co-Chairs China and EASA welcomed participants to the meeting.
- c) Secretariat support to the meeting was provided by the Chief and Technical Officers of the Implementation Planning and Support Section for Safety of the Air Navigation Bureau.

#### 2.2 Approval of the draft agenda

- a) The agenda was approved. The presentations and documentation are available at: <a href="https://www.icao.int/safety/ASIAP/Pages/default.aspx">https://www.icao.int/safety/ASIAP/Pages/default.aspx</a>
- b) The meeting agreed to move the Global Aviation Cooperation Symposium (GACS) Agenda Item to be the first item for discussion as requested by TCB.

#### 2.3 Report on the Global Aviation Cooperation Symposium (GACS)

a) ICAO TCB provided a short summary on the conference that was held in Athens, Greece from 11 to 13 October 2017 (<a href="https://www.icao.int/meetings/GACS2017/Pages/default.aspx">https://www.icao.int/meetings/GACS2017/Pages/default.aspx</a>). Representatives from 65 countries and 21 International Organizations participated in the conference to exchange information on technical cooperation, challenges for resource

mobilization, success stories, as well as lessons learned. It was agreed to include information on ASIAP for the next GACS, which will be held in early 2019.

#### 2.4 Review of the ASIAP Action Plan with Updates

- a) ICAO advised that the ASIAP Prioritization Tool has been online for about 6 months on both the ICAO iSTARS and the public website (<a href="https://www.icao.int/safety/ASIAP/Pages/ASIAP-APP.aspx">https://www.icao.int/safety/ASIAP/Pages/ASIAP-APP.aspx</a>). Feedback was received from one State concerned about the use of the World Bank's Worldwide Governance Indicators (WGIs). Links to the WGI information have been included on the public site, however the information in its original form is available on the iSTARS.
- b) ICAO also advised that there are some States that are unique (i.e. Monaco, unaudited States) and as a result, the data shown may not be reflective of the actual needs. It will be necessary to figure out a way to deal with these anomalies in the tool. Comments from Partners are welcome.
- c) The UK, France, EASA and ICAO formed a working group to determine project outcome indicators for use by the ASIAP Partners. The TORs were circulated and approved on 30 September 2017. Both EASA and ICAO have posted examples on the ASIAP website applying the project indictors to technical assistance projects implemented. It was noted that some indicators can be quickly assessed, while others may take significant time (i.e. audits, etc.). Partners were encouraged to apply the indictors to their technical assistance projects and to provide feedback to ICAO for the improvement of the indicators.
- d) ICAO advised that a beta version of the Projects Database is available online (<a href="https://www.icao.int/safety/ASIAP/Pages/Tools.aspx">https://www.icao.int/safety/ASIAP/Pages/Tools.aspx</a>) and that Partners are able to upload information about their projects. The intent behind this tool is to share basic information on Partners' technical assistance projects, promote transparency and reduce duplication of efforts. The UK and EASA both noted that they have incorporated project information into the tool and that the process was very quick and simple. It was agreed that all Partners should include at least 1 project in the tool by the end of January. ICAO will continue to work on the tool, including how the information is presented on the website, with an anticipated launch in early 2018.
- e) ICAO provided an update on its work related to Regional Safety Oversight Organizations (RSOOs), including the RSOO Global Forum that was conducted in March, the Action Plan on RSOOs that was developed, as well as the initial study on the Global Aviation Safety Oversight System (GASOS). Additionally, the first meeting of the Cooperative Platform for RSOOs would be held on 15 December. It was agreed that RSOOs will not be brought into ASIAP, but that ICAO will coordinate between ASIAP and the RSOO platform.

#### 2.5 **Update on Priority States**

- a) ICAO highlighted that the original reason ASIAP came together was to focus on key Priority States. The initial list of States included: Cambodia, Nepal, Viet Nam and Indonesia. Safety has improved in most of these States.
- b) The following updates were provided:

- Haiti has received assistance from the ICAO Regional Office in collaboration with two RSOOs. An ICVM may be conducted in 2018 for the SSC. Additional funding is required for assistance activities.
- DSNA (France) is currently in discussions for assistance to Djibouti.
- Cambodia continues to have difficulties and the ICAO Regional Office is currently
  drafting a project to address their concerns (primarily in the area of ANS). It was
  agreed that the ASIAP Partners should collaborate on the implementation of the
  project.
- The UK has been working for the past year and a half in Thailand under their technical assistance project. Thailand has the political will to support the necessary work required.
- Thailand is an excellent example of ASIAP Partners sharing information regarding their assistance activities. This has promoted transparency, alignment and harmonization of objectives, and reduced any chances for the duplication of efforts.
- China has signed an agreement with ICAO and will provide an earmarked contribution of \$4 million dollars under the South Cooperation Assistance Fund. The funding will include the development of a "Civil Aviation Middle Manager Training Course for Global Developing Countries" and assistance to the Republic of Congo and Tanzania.
- The ICAO Regional Director from Dakar advised of the success of assistance efforts in Africa for the resolution of SSCs. Two SSCs remain and it is hoped that they will be resolved within 6 months.
- Canada is continuing to provide support to Guyana, including a Compliance and Enforcement workshop that will be held in February 2018.
- EASA has opened an office in Singapore, facilitating assistance in the region. On a regional level, they have been providing assistance to Indonesia and the Philippines.

#### 2.6 **Discussion on Indonesia**

- a) ICAO noted that Indonesia has always been on the list of priority States for assistance, and the ASIAP Partners had agreed to coordinate efforts for technical assistance. However, a recent ICVM shows a high level of effective implementation, therefore assistance may not be required. Assistance in the areas of accident investigation and aerodromes may still be considered.
- b) France advised of their work in Indonesia, including the provision of one expert working in-country. Some progress has been made, but additional work is required. The ASIAP Partners agreed to keep an eye on the progress of Indonesia for one year to see if additional assistance will be required and that France will keep the Partners updated on progress achieved.
- c) ACI has conducted an APEX review in Indonesia and they have been very receptive at the airport level.

## 2.7 **Updated ASIAP Action Plan**

- a) ICAO referred to the earlier discussion on the status of activities under the current action plan (2.4 above refers).
- b) ICAO proposed the following additional action items for 2018 with proposed timelines for implementation:
  - Identification of candidate Priority States for development of projects by collaborative means (mid 2018);
  - Review of success of Project Outcome Indicators (2nd quarter 2018);
  - Enhancement of ASIAP Prioritisation and Projects Database Tools (2nd quarter 2018);
  - Promotion of ASIAP work (varies/on-going).

#### 2.8 **ASIAP Contributions to next Assembly**

- a) It was noted that the 13th Air Navigation Conference will be held in October 2018, and would be an excellent opportunity to promote the work of ASIAP prior to the next Assembly.
- b) UK agreed to take the lead on the development of a paper on ASIAP activities that will be coordinated with ICAO and the Partners. ICAO will provide information on the timeline for submission of papers for the conference.
- c) The next ASIAP meeting will be held during the Air Navigation Conference and discussions on presenting ASIAP at the Assembly can be further discussed.

## 2.9 **Report on ICAO Resource Mobilization**

- a) ICAO provided an overview of the establishment of a Strategic Planning, Coordination and Partnerships Office under the Office of the Secretary General and its activities. The presentation can be found on the ASIAP website (https://www.icao.int/safety/ASIAP/Pages/Third-ASIAP-Meeting.aspx).
- b) ACI advised of the publication of the Aviation Benefits Document that was developed by the Industry High Level Group (IHLG) comprised of ICAO, ACI, CANSO, IATA and ICCAIA. This document is an excellent tool to advocate for civil aviation and should be included as a tool for ASIAP. It was agreed to promote the document and include on the ASIAP website.
- c) ICAO has developed a template for project proposals for resource mobilisation which will be posted on the ASIAP web site to share with Partners.

#### 2.10 **Election of Co-Chairs**

a) ICAO advised that, based on the TORs, the current tenure of the Co-Chairs had concluded. The Partners agreed to re-elect both EASA and China to Co-Chair ASIAP for the next two-year period.

#### 2.11 **Next Meeting**

a) It was agreed that the next ASIAP meeting would be held during the 13th Air Navigation Conference that will be held from 9-19 October 2018, probably around the Safety

Committee being held during the first week (10 - 13 October 2018). ICAO will communicate the date of the ASIAP meeting closer to the Conference.

## 2.12 **Any Other Business**

None

## 2.13 Closing

- a) ICAO closed the meeting by thanking all of the Partners for their continued support and cooperation.
- b) It was noted that greater participation from all Partners is necessary to the success of our work.
- c) Inclusion of Partners from the only missing region, the Middle East States is encouraged. ICAO has approached Saudi Arabia and UAE, but they have not yet joined ASIAP. ICAO encouraged the ASIAP Partners to reach out to States in the Middle East Region to consider becoming ASIAP Partners.
