

## FOURTH ICAO AVIATION SAFETY IMPLEMENTATION ASSISTANCE PARTNERSHIP MEETING (ASIAP/4)

#### Montréal, Canada, 9 October 2018

#### **REPORT**

#### 1. **INTRODUCTION**

- 1.1 The Fourth ICAO Aviation Safety Implementation Assistance Partnership (ASIAP/4) meeting was held at ICAO Headquarters in Montréal, Canada, on 9 October as a side meeting of the 13<sup>th</sup> Air Navigation Conference (AN-Conf/13) and was attended by 30 participants (Appendix A), including one participant via teleconference.
- 1.2 The objective of the ASIAP meeting is for ASIAP Partners to discuss their technical assistance activities and to explore possibilities to collaborate on assistance efforts in ASIAP Priority States.

#### 2. SUMMARY OF MEETING DISCUSSIONS

#### 2.1 **Opening of the Meeting**

- a) The meeting was opened by the Deputy Director, Aviation Safety, of the ICAO Air Navigation Bureau. He highlighted the importance of ASIAP for coordinating and cooperating on the implementation of technical assistance activities in order to enhance effectiveness of the assistance. He also emphasized the need for all the ASIAP partners to take a more active role.
- b) The representatives from the Co-Chairs, China and EASA, welcomed participants to the meeting.
- c) Secretariat support to the meeting was provided by the Chief and Technical Officers of the Programmes Coordination and Implementation Section of the Air Navigation Bureau.

#### 2.2 Approval of the draft agenda

a) The agenda was approved. The Regional Safety Oversight Organizations Cooperative Platform (RSOO CP) presentation and meeting documentation are available at: https://www.icao.int/safety/ASIAP/Pages/default.aspx

#### 2.3 Review of the ASIAP Action Plan with Updates

- a) ICAO reviewed and provided an update on activities under the ASIAP Action Plan document. This document outlines the actions identified by the Partners to be implemented, including timelines and progress/updates. ICAO advised of the following updates:
  - Partners continue to provide updates on a quarterly basis, or as needed, on technical assistance activities. The sharing of information also includes discussions on assistance

- activities, if any, for Priority States. The Chief Technical Advisor of the COSCAP-SEA recommended some additional updates be made to the ASIAP Prioritization Tool, including the possibility of showing sub-regions and adding more granularity to the technical areas (i.e. splitting up AGA and ANS). The UK further supported updates to the Prioritization Tool.
- ICAO advised that a presentation on the Regional Safety Oversight Organization Cooperative Platform (RSOO CP) would be provided later in the meeting. This would provide an opportunity for partners to learn more about the platform, including any synergies for cooperation.
- The Working Group on Project Outcomes Indicators (POIs) met in September to review the status and effectiveness of the POIs. Two Protocol Questions (PQs) have been removed from the audit process and are being replaced with new PQs on State Safety Programmes (SSPs) that will initially be evaluated on a voluntary basis, but will later become a part of the audit process in 2020. It was agreed that additional indicators will need to be considered and should be explored further by the Working Group. The need to discuss the issue of transparency was raised by one of the Partners for the use of the POIs. Consideration should be given to sharing publicly the outcomes of projects against the POIs.
- An updated project database tool is available on-line for Partners to incorporate information on their technical assistance activities (<a href="https://www.icao.int/safety/ASIAP/Pages/Tools.aspx">https://www.icao.int/safety/ASIAP/Pages/Tools.aspx</a>). The updated tool includes a map highlighting Partner projects, as well as quick viewing of project information. Partners are encouraged to sign up for an account and include information on their assistance projects in order to facilitate the sharing of information.
- ICAO provided an update on collaboration efforts on the development of a project
  document for Cambodia. With funding from China, ICAO and Boeing, ICAO TCB is in
  the process of identifying technical experts to begin implementation of the project.
  ICAO highlighted the need for qualified technical experts for this project and other
  assistance activities and encouraged Partners to share their experts with ICAO for the
  implementation of projects.
- ICAO and the ASIAP Partners continue to promote the work of ASIAP. The UK submitted a paper on behalf of the ASIAP Partners that will be presented at the AN-Conf/13 under Agenda Item 7.3 (WP/213). Discussions on the development and submission of a paper to the 40th Assembly will be discussed later in the meeting.

#### 2.4 **Partner Updates**

- a) **Transport Canada** Transport Canada (TC) advised that they are developing their own technical assistance programme. They have been providing ad-hoc assistance to Guyana, Brazil and Haiti, and are coordinating with Partners on these activities. TC is also working closely with the ICAO Regional Office and is a Champion State for SSP implementation. Transport Canada is interested in becoming more active in technical assistance activities.
- b) **France** France continues to provide assistance to the ASEAN States, with a particular focus on Philippines, Laos, Thailand, and Indonesia. Additionally, France continues to work closely with other Partners, such as EASA and the UK for the provision of assistance.

- c) United Kingdom The UK is working closely with ICAO Regional Offices (Bangkok and Lima) for the provision of technical assistance. The UK is also interested in connecting with the MID office this week to discuss collaboration on assistance. The UK is working with the ICAO APAC office in regards to assistance for aerodromes and is working closely with EASA and France in Thailand. Additionally, the UK is working with TC and the FAA for assistance in the Caribbean.
- d) EASA EASA is expanding their technical assistance, including their Aviation Partnership Projects (APPs) into new regions, i.e. Latin America. A new EASA project office has been opened in San Jose, Costa Rica. EASA continues to provide assistance to the Western Balkans, Eastern Europe, Caucasus, Central, South and South East Asia, and new projects are about to be launched in Africa. EASA is collaborating with other ASIAP Partners in Thailand. Bilateral projects are also being undertaken in Zambia and Ukraine.
- e) **ICAO RO Mexico City** The Regional Office is coordinating with EASA on the EU/LA project and is coordinating with TC and France on Haiti.
- f) ICAO RO Cairo The first Middle East RSOO Steering Committee Meeting (MENA) was recently held. The RO advised that Lebanon, Libya and Syria are below 60% effective implementation and should be prioritized in the region for assistance. Neither Yemen nor Iraq have been audited, however the security situation in Iraq is improving, therefore ICAO RO is looking to collaborate on assistance activities for Iraq.
- g) ICAO RO Bangkok The Cambodia project is moving forward. A project document has been developed for Nepal for creating autonomy of the Air Navigation Service Provider (ANSP) from the CAA. Nepal is funding 25% of the project, but additional funding will be necessary. CAT missions continue to Thailand, utilizing surplus funds. ASIAP to be promoted at DGCA meeting in Fiji in 2 weeks. COSCAP-SEA is completing a survey of State needs and information can be used to determine the delta of work required and possible areas of collaboration with Partners.
- h) ICAO RO Lima The regional safety oversight organization (SRVSOP) is working very well. Guyana is improving and receiving assistance from TC, including for helicopters. As a result of the assistance, Guyana is improving its safety oversight capability and it is expected that their EI will increase. Suriname was working with UK CAAi under an Inter-American Development Bank (IADB) contract, however additional assistance is required in order to raise their EI.
- i) **ICAO RO Paris** The Regional Office is conducting a mission to Ukraine in November and then to Uzbekistan and will review their action plans. A Significant Safety Concern (SSC) in Kyrgyzstan remains unresolved and the RO is meeting with EASA to discuss possible collaborative efforts for assistance.
- j) ICAO SPCP SPCP is working to review agreements between ICAO and Partners in order to make them more effective and include accountability. ASIAP can work with SPCP regarding resource mobilization. Work is also being done to promote national civil aviation master plans and raise importance of aviation in national strategies.

#### 2.5 Regional Safety Oversight Organization Cooperative Platform (RSOO CP)

- a) A presentation was provided by ICAO on the work of the RSOO CP. The platform serves as a means to bring together RSOOs and COSCAPs to discuss experiences, challenges and opportunities, including the sharing of best practices. The platform can help to strengthen the capabilities of RSOOs, including possibilities for technical assistance to the RSOOs or through them to Member States.
- b) It was noted that the Civil Aviation Safety and Security Oversight System (CASSOS) in the Caribbean has not been an active member of the RSOO CP and they should be encouraged to participate in order to strengthen their safety oversight capabilities.
- c) Partners were encouraged to coordinate and collaborate with RSOOs for the provision of technical assistance.

#### 2.6 ASIAP Contributions to next Assembly

a) It was agreed that the Partners would review the outcomes of the 13<sup>th</sup> Air Navigation Conference regarding the ASIAP paper to determine next steps for the preparation of a paper for the 40<sup>th</sup> Assembly in September/October 2019.

#### 2.7 **Next Meeting**

- a) It was agreed that quarterly telecoms would continue in order to further coordination and collaboration.
- b) The next face-to-face ASIAP meeting will be held as a side-bar to the 40<sup>th</sup> Assembly.

#### 2.8 Any Other Business (AOB)

- a) Consideration should be given to the provision of free training to States that are identified as a priority under the ASIAP Prioritization Tool.
- b) An updated Terms of Reference (TORs) will be circulated to Partners with the meeting report. Partners are to review the TORs for approval at the next telecom.

#### 2.9 Closing

- a) Partners are encouraged to recommend/refer technical experts to ICAO to assist with the implementation of technical assistance projects.
- b) The Co-Chairs closed the meeting by thanking all of the Partners for their continued support and cooperation.
