Reporting medium	Paper based for visual inspection might be the only option in the short term, but it is recommended to incorporate QR codes or visible digital seals as soon as the technology becomes available	
	Electronic format preferable with QR code, machine-readable barcode, visible digital seal	
	Result could be uploaded to government portal by administering centre, health professional	
	In all instances, procedures need to be clearly documented and communicated to stakeholders and passengers	
	Specific procedure and guidelines during transition from paper based to digital certificates	
Certificate validity period	Valid from (recommended) (dd/mm/yyyy)	
	Valid to (if recommended) (dd/mm/yyyy)	
Paper based proof of vaccination	Paper reports should be printed and not hand-written	
	If handwritten text is unavoidable, an official stamp need to be affixed to the certificate, with the signature and contact details of the person who has administered the vaccination	
Copy of vaccination certificate	Copy of vaccination certificate report to be carried by passengers at all times for verification	
Lost certificates	Procedure if vaccination certificate cannot be produced	
Communication	Communication strategy to inform passengers and stakeholders of the vaccination and verification requirements	
Data protection and privacy regulations	Processes and/or procedures in full compliance with applicable laws and regulations
