TABLE 7-1 - SEGREGATION BETWEEN PACKAGES

(Presented by J. Code)

1. INTRODUCTION

1.1 **Table 7-1- Segregation between packages** provides a quick visual reference, which assists loaders in determining segregation requirements between packages containing certain Classes and Divisions of dangerous goods having different hazards.

An “x” at the intersection of a row and column indicates that packages containing these classes of dangerous goods may not be stowed next to or in contact with each other, or in a position which would allow interaction in the event of leakage of the contents. Thus, a package containing Class 3 dangerous goods may not be stowed next to or in contact with a package containing Division 5.1 dangerous goods.

Note 1. — See 2.2.2.2 through 2.2.2.4.

Note 2. — This class or division must not be stowed together with explosives other than those in Division 1.4, Compatibility Group S.

Note 3. — Packages containing dangerous goods with multiple hazards in the class or divisions which require segregation in accordance with Table 7-1 need not be segregated from other packages bearing the same UN number.

However, Table 7-1 does not include information on the:

- Segregation of Division 6.1, 6.2 or Class 7 from other dangerous goods, or
- Segregation of all dangerous goods from animals and foodstuffs.

2. PROPOSAL

2.1 The Panel is asked to approve the forming of an Ad-Hoc Working Group tasked with examining **Table 7-1 – Segregation between packages** with a view to considering the inclusion of additional relevant segregation information such as:

- Segregation of Division 6.1, 6.2 or Class 7 from other dangerous goods, and
- Segregation of all dangerous goods from animals and foodstuffs

This Ad-Hoc Working Group may wish to take into consideration the segregation tables developed by air operators and other organizations such as the International Maritime Dangerous Goods Code.
