**DANGEROUS GOODS TO PROVIDE MEDICAL AID IN FLIGHT**

(Presented by G. A. Leach)

**SUMMARY**

This paper seeks to clarify the conditions under which dangerous goods may be carried to provide medical aid to a patient.

Action by the DGP-WG is in paragraph 2.

**1. INTRODUCTION**

1.1 A recent alignment of European regulations with the Technical Instructions resulted in the deletion of text which, it was believed, should be included in the Technical Instructions to clarify the circumstances under which dangerous goods may be carried for the purposes of providing medical aid to a patient.

1.2 The current wording of Part 1;1.1.3.1 a) is intended to apply to dedicated air ambulance flights and also instances where, for example, an operator may remove seats from a conventional scheduled flight and carry a patient. However, the wording has been interpreted by some as meaning one circumstance or the other, not both, and it is suggested clarification of this text would aid understanding.

**2. ACTION BY THE DGP-WG**

2.1 The DGP-WG is invited to amend Part 1;1.1.3.1 a) as follows:

1.1.3.1 Except for 7;4.2, these Instructions do not apply to dangerous goods carried on an aircraft where the dangerous goods are:

- a) placed on board with the approval of the operator or form part of the permanent equipment of the aeroplane when it has been adapted for specialized use for medical evacuation, to provide, during flight, medical aid to a patient providing that:

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
