1. **Beneficiary State/Group of States: 18WACAF States** 2. **Project No.:** WACAF/2016/005 3. **Project Title:** Assistance to selected WACAF States in the establishment of an effective and operational Search And Rescue organization 4. **Project Duration:** 8 months (starting in April 2016) 5. **Implementation Agency: ICAO** 6. **Source of Funding:** AFI Plan 7. **Estimated budget:** \$US 54,600

Project justification

- 1. The need for the provision of effective Search and Rescue (SAR) services and regional collaboration to achieve same, have become important global agenda items following recent aircraft accidents and the challenges encountered in the provision of SAR.
- 2. The AFI region, particularly some WACAF States has activated SAR services following aircraft accidents. Some accident investigation reports have pointed out the need for more awareness on SAR.A purposeful action would be to encourage and assist States to sign or update SAR agreements and manuals.
- 3. The provision of effective SAR services entails the mobilization of essential State assets including those of the Air Force, Navy and other State institutions. Additionally, assets of neighbouring States and other organizations are most likely to be involved in SAR missions and would require the approval of high-level authorities.
- 4. The sixteenth meeting of the AFI Plan Steering Committee (Montreal November 2015)identified the need for urgent action to increase the capacity of AFI States to provide effective SAR services and recommended that SAR be included in the AFI ANS Performance Indicators and Targets. The Steering Committee further requested the AFI Plan Secretariat to develop and implement projects to assist States in key priority areas including SAR organisation.
- 5. In addition, the 20th meeting of APIRG (Yamoussoukro Nov 2015)recognizing the importance and need for improvement of SAR service delivery, called for a regional framework to facilitate operational cooperation and efficiency in SAR, establishment of SAR Team of Experts and SAR Support Project.
- 6. Furthermore, APIRG/20 adopted a set of AFI ANS key Performance Indicators and Targets including the requirement to establish effective and operational Search and Rescue (SAR) organization by 31 December 2016.
- 7. The AFI Plan Steering committee has endorsed the need for the establishment of a robust and a collaborative SAR regime in the AFI region.

A. End of Project Status/ Target / Overall Objective

1. By the end of the project, effectiveness of SAR organization in WACAF States will increase as more coordination would have been conducted and Agreements signed both internally within States and between neighbouring States. Furthermore, the awareness on SAR will have increased, generating more resources that could be made available for SAR.

2. Implementation strategy

- 2.1 The project will be implemented by ICAO WACAF Office and a team of experts from among WACAF States that will provide technical support on a needs basis via missions or remote documentation review and drafting.
- 2.2 The initial stage of the project will consist of a gap analysis to have up to date information on the current level of implementation in, the result of which will constitute the basis for designing the details of the assistance to be provided to States.

- 2.3 This assistance will comprise an initial workshop followed by assistance/facilitation activities to States either individually or in groups (depending on the outcomes of the gap analysis) to reinforce coordination and in the signing of SAR Manuals and Agreements.
- 2.4 Sensitization actions will also be required at a senior level in States' civil and military authorities responsible for SAR services to facilitate the successful completion of this project.

C. Inputs:

1. Input from States

- 1.1. **Counterparts**: Focal points designated by each CAA will provide assistance in coordination, following up for their respective States. The coordination will englobe all States' entities involved in Search and Rescue.
- 1.2. **Support staff**: CAAs will provide ICAO staff with support staff if necessary.
- 1.3. **Office(s)**: CAAs will provide their Focal Point with the necessary tools (telephone, internet, printer, meeting room etc.) for an effective coordination.
- 1.4. **Workshop**: Each State will ensure the participation of its focal point as well as other key stakeholders to the workshop by providing travel and per diems.
- 1.5. **Transport**: CAAs will provide local transportation to ICAO staff while on site. The CAAs will also facilitate obtaining entry visas for the ICAO RO, and will provide any other assistance that may be necessary for the fulfilment of their missions.

2. ICAO Input

- 2.1. **Funding for the project**: The project will be funded by AFI PLAN.
- 2.2. **Experts**: ICAO will mainly rely on the Dakar RO ATM.
- 2.3. **International missions**: an allowance is provided to cover the ICAO Staff missions as well as the participation of the TET in the workshop and assistance missions expenses where needed.
- 2.4. **Monitoring and reporting**: ICAO Regional Office in Dakar will be responsible for the supervision of the project, the production of the Project Terminal report. It will also establish and maintain coordination with all the stakeholders during the course of the project.
- 2.5. Workshop: ICAO will cover the costs of the workshop using project funds
- 2.6. **Miscellaneous expenses,** administrative overhead that may be incurred will be paid by the project funds.
