#### **Executive Summary**

The PPT presents a summarized report of the AFI-CIS activities up to June 2023. AFCAC, through the AFI-CIS Program, supports African member States to enhance their effective implementation of ICAO Standards & Recommended Practises (SARPs) and to improve their EI status. The program is now supported by 150 Experts from 36 African member States. The average EI Status for African member States increased steadily from 44% in year 2012 when the AFI CIS was established to 57.82% by June 2023.

#### AFI CIS Contribution to aviation safety in Africa

- ☐ Year 2012 AFI Cooperative Inspectorate Scheme (AFI CIS) was established It is a pool of qualified and experienced Aviation Safety Inspectors from Africa.
- The objective of this program is to assist African States to eliminate all Significant Safety Concerns (SSCs) and to increase their Effective Implementation (EI) of the ICAO SARPs. This program aims at reinforcing the skills of national inspectors in charge of the safety oversight activities.
- ☐ Funding for training and technical assistance missions is provided by the EU-ASA project.
- ☐ Training of inspectors was conducted in 2012; 2016; 2021 and 2023.
- ☐ The AFI CIS database has expanded from 16 to 150 AFI CIS inspectors from 41 African member States. All the newly trained inspectors are going through OJT which began in June 2021.



#### AFI CIS Contribution to aviation safety in Africa

At least 70 AFI CIS inspectors from 21 member States were trained in 2021 and additional 68 Inspectors were trained in 2023. The formal training and the OJT are aimed at reinforcing key skills to the national inspectors.

Since its inception in year 2012, at least thirty five (35) technical assistance missions in 23 different States were conducted, which contributed to the resolution of SSCs and increase of the EI level of implementation of the ICAO SARPS. Areas covered include-AGA, AIR, ANS, PEL and OPS.



#### AFI CIS Contribution to aviation safety in Africa


At the inception of AFI CIS in year 2012, there were at least 15 Significant Safety Concerns (SSCs) in the AFI region and yet by December 2022 two (2) new SSCs relating to ANS were reported. The AFI CIS program was a key contributor to this positive result as a considerable number of targeted technical assistance missions have been conducted.





# AFI CIS Contribution to Aviation Safety in Africa

El for African member States - 33 out of 54 member States reached the target of 60% El with an average El of 57.82% (In year 2012 the average El for Africa was 44% and only 13 States were above 60% El). This reflects a huge increase of 13.82% El when comparison is done between 2012 and 2021.

- 2. Provide tangible safetyoversight system improvements– such as on-line systems for surveillance and certification;
- 3. Provide tangible safety oversight system improvements to member States such as online systems for surveillance and certification.
