Attribute Values

The highest level of injury was fatal. (Fatal)	1
<i>For statistical purposes "Fatal" is death from an injury received in the occurrence which occurs within 30 days of the accident. ICAO Annex 13.</i>	
The highest level of injury was serious. (Serious)	2
<i>A serious injury is an injury sustained by a person in an accident and which:</i>	
<i>a) requires hospitalization for more than 48 hours, commencing within 48 hours from the date when the injury was received; or</i>	
<i>b) results in a fracture of any bone (except simple fractures of fingers, toes, or nose or;</i>	
<i>c) involves lacerations which cause severe hemorrhage, nerve, muscle or tendon damage; or</i>	
<i>d) involves injury to any internal organ; or</i>	
<i>e) involves second or third degree burns, or any burns affecting more than 5 percent of the body surface; or</i>	
<i>f) involves verified exposure to infectious substances or injurious radiation.</i>	
The highest level of injury was minor. (Minor)	3
No injuries occurred. (None)	98
The highest level of injury sustained is not known. (Unknown)	99
