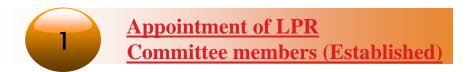
Who is responsible for LPR?

- The testing procedure and raters shall be approved by Lao DCA
- Scheduled & unscheduled audit will be made by Lao DCA

Responsibilities of the committee:

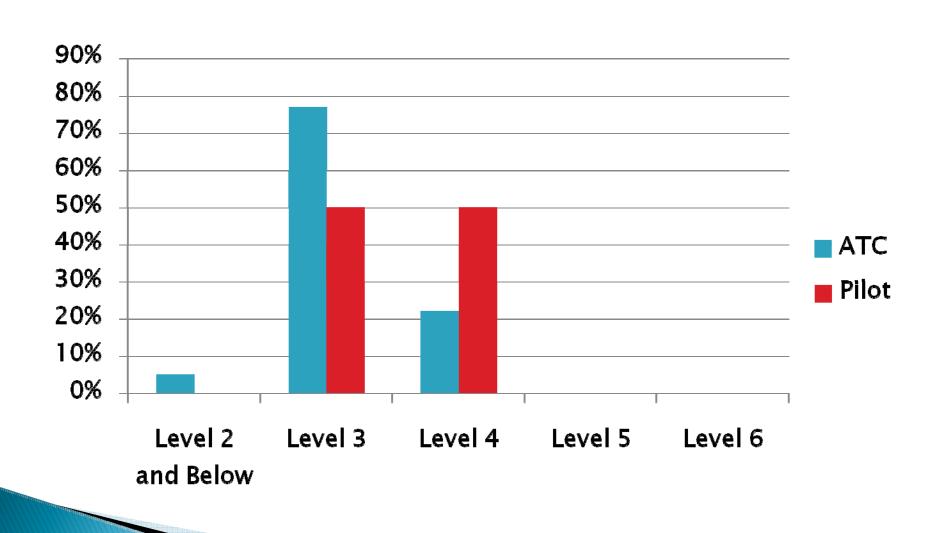
- > Give LPR counseling service to general director of ATS

First assessment (2007)

- ▶ 41 ATC all together working in international environment (Vientiane, LuangPhabang and Pakse international airports)
- Assessment made by an assessor (PACTEC), from SAA (Singapore) Assessment result:
 - None expert controller
 - None extended level
 - 9 operational level (21,95%)
 - > 32 pre-operational level (77,4%)

First assessment (2007)

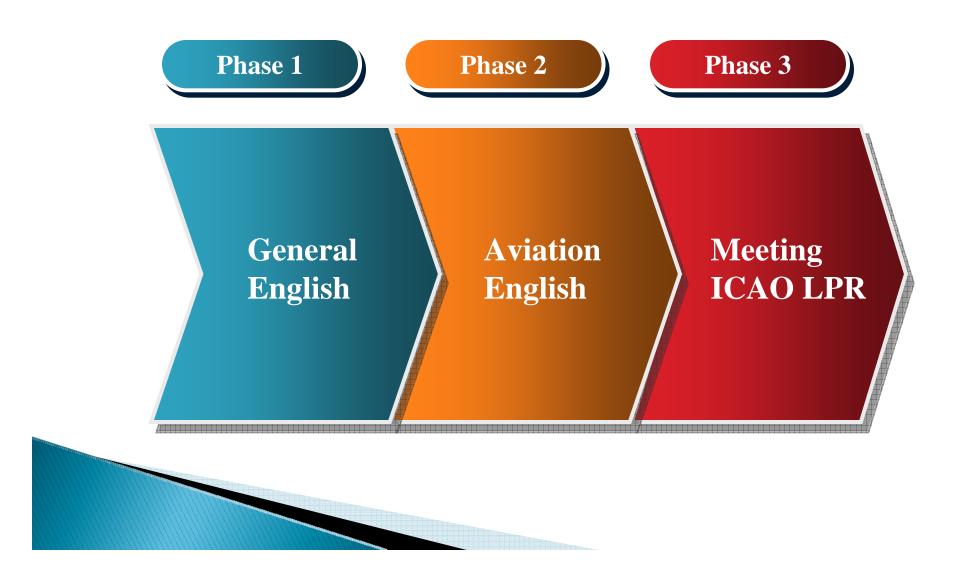

- > Part 2: the candidate will be interviewed by three raters designated by ICAO standardization according ICAO rating scale

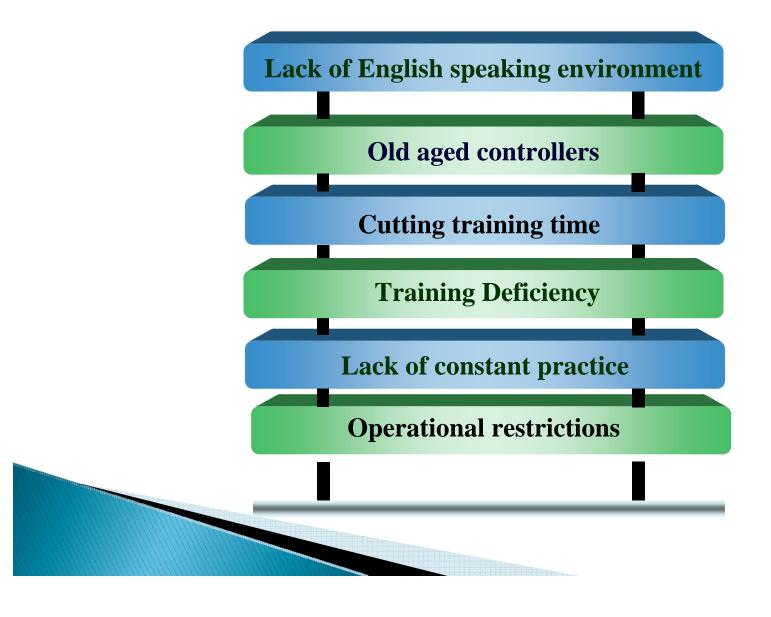

Pass and fail in interview part

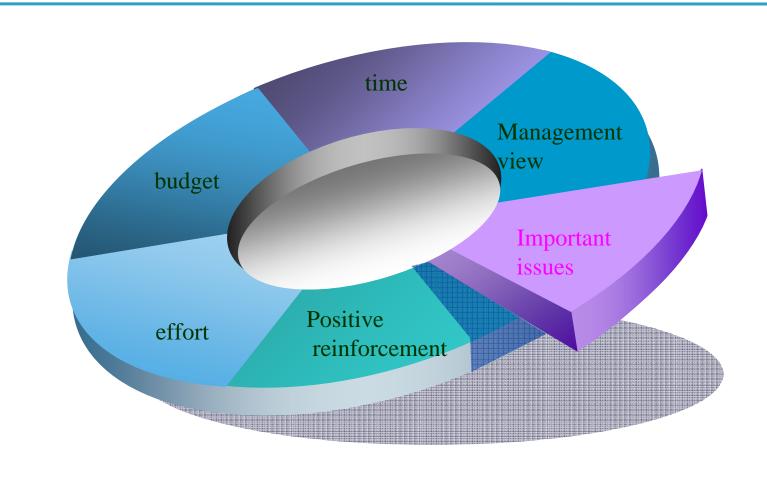
New policy
