2 - Estimate of National Level of Implementation

In January-February 2008, qualification testing was conducted for the preliminary assessment of the level of English language proficiency in accordance with the ICAO requirements. Based on testing results, appropriate certificates are issued. The testing results are provided below:

Total number of air traffic controllers involved in international operations who have undergone testing: 75. Twenty-four (24) air traffic controllers possess level 4 and higher, which amounts to 32.0 per cent.

Subsequent assessments of the implementation of ICAO English language proficiency Standards at the national level will be conducted on an annual basis up until 5 March 2011. The preliminary data in the Transition Plan for the Implementation of ICAO Standards will be updated based on the annual testing results.

3 – Language Proficiency Training Programmes

The training of flight and controller personnel is conducted in specialized aviation educational institutions, at civil aviation training centres of the Republic of Tajikistan and at certified foreign aviation educational institutions, based on programmes approved by the Civil Aviation Administration of the Republic of Tajikistan.

After 5 March 2008, it is planned to conduct the testing of flight and controller personnel with the use of "TELLCAP," a certified training and testing programme developed by specialists from the "Complang" Russian language training centre. In order to implement the State Plan for the Transition to ICAO Language Training Standards by the end of 2008, it is planned to train two examiners and two raters from the teaching and instructor staff of the training centre, of the flight complex and of the Air Traffic Control Centre of the "Tajik Air" State Unitary Aviation Enterprise.

5 - Interim Measures to Mitigate the Risk

The following are the key measures to mitigate the level of risk during the transition period:

- Ensuring a full staffing level for the flight crew and air traffic control points involved in international operations;
- Ensuring a strict use of standard radio communication phraseology between aircraft crew and ATS controllers;
- Ensuring that specialists with greater training are used as crew members on aircraft involved in international operations at busy airports;
- Ensuring that specialists with a greater level of English proficiency are used within the busiest ATS sectors;
- Ensuring ongoing quality control in the management of radio communications;
- Ensuring oversight of the process for training specialists on the part of the aviation administration, the aircraft operator, and ANS provider;
- Improving the methods for training and testing flight and controller staff;
- Limiting the hiring of specialists whose English language proficiency level is lower than the established level.
