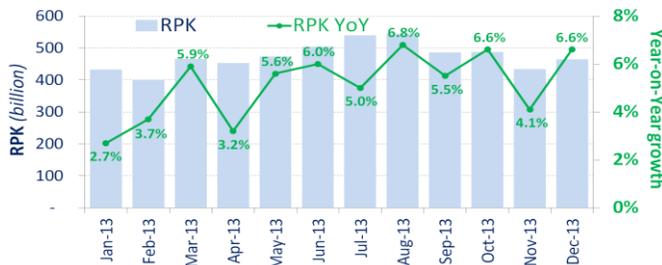

PASSENGER TRAFFIC

Revenue Passenger-Kilometres - RPK

World passenger traffic grew by +6.6% in December 2013 compared to December 2012, the second highest increase in 2013, tied with October traffic growth.

The fourth quarter of 2013 posted the highest economic growth of the year in the developed and developing countries. The December air traffic growth largely outpaced the world economic growth.

CAPACITY

Available Seat-Kilometres - ASK

Capacity worldwide increased by +6.0% in December 2013, representing the 8th consecutive month with growth over 5%. This growth is the third highest increase in capacity in the last 12 months, October 2013 being the highest.

Capacity is expected to increase by +6.5% in December 2013, representing the highest increase over the last 12 months, tied with October capacity growth.

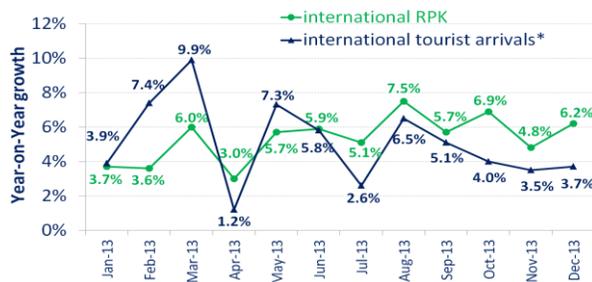

International Traffic

In December 2013, international markets grew slower than domestic ones for the fourth time in 2013, posting +6.2% increase year-on-year.

International tourist arrivals grew at a slower pace at +3.7%, which is 0.2 percentage points higher than the previous month.

Load Factor - LF

The passenger Load Factor, reaching 78.7% in December 2013, increased by +0.8 percentage points compared to December 2012.

Compared to the previous month (November 2013) LF increased by +2.4 percentage points in December 2013.

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TOP 15 AIRPORTS

DEC 2013: +0.9% YoY in terms of departures for the Top 15

In term of departures, the Top 15 airports reported an increase of +0.9% in December 2013 compared to December 2012.

Atlanta remains first despite a year-on-year decrease of -0.6% in December 2013.

Nine airports recorded a positive growth and among them, Los Angeles (+6.9%), Jakarta (+6.2%) and San Francisco (+5.7%) recorded the highest rates, the two latter entering the Top 15 compared to December 2012. San Francisco and Charlotte grew at the fastest pace in terms of passengers with double digit growth rates.

The largest decrease was performed by Dallas (-4.4%) and Denver (-4.4%), the latter having recorded, every month in 2013, a decrease in terms of departures.

Regarding the European airports in the Top 15, Paris and London decreased by -4.1% and -2.5%, respectively.

Beijing, the sole airport of the Top 15 from the Asia/Pacific region, ranked second in terms of passengers with over 3 million passengers embarked in December 2013.

Airports Council International announced that global passenger traffic ended the year strong with year-over-year growth of over 6% for the month of December. This represents the month with the highest growth over a twelve month period.

TOP 15 AIRLINES

DEC 2013: +5.9% YoY in terms of RPK for the Top 15

In terms of RPK, 14 of the Top 15 airlines posted a positive growth in December 2013 compared to one year ago. The Top 15 grew at +5.9% which is 0.7 percentage points lower than the world average.

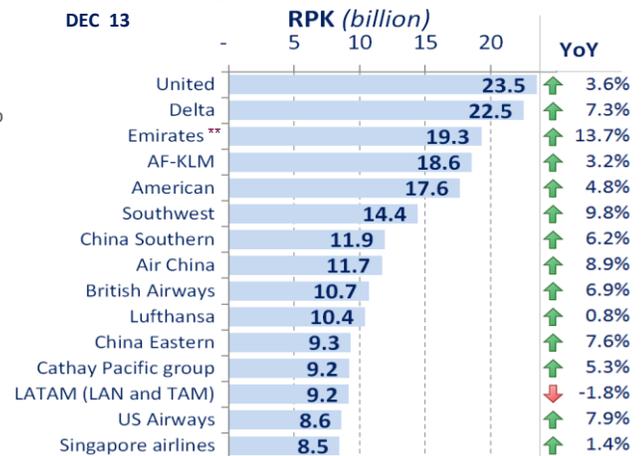
The sole decrease was recorded by LATAM (-1.8%), the only Latin American carrier of the Top 15.

The highest growth rate of the Top 15 was recorded by Emirates (+13.7%) which, for the first time this year, performed the third largest traffic volume of the month, overtaking AF-KLM.

As the merger between American Airlines and US Airways became effective on 9th December 2013, the traffic data will only be provided next month for the grouped airline.

Southwest posted a +9.8% increase in December 2013 which is its highest growth rate recorded over 2013.

British Airways grew at +6.9% (third consecutive month over 5%), AF-KLM grew at +3.2%, while Lufthansa recorded the lowest growth among the European airlines of the top 15 with +0.8%.

CAPACITY BY REGION (ICAO Statistical Regions)

DEC 2013

All regions showed positive growth in December 2013 compared to one year ago, with a +6.0% increase in capacity worldwide.

The airlines of the Middle East recorded the highest growth every month of 2013, posting an increase of 13.2% in December 2013.

Similar to the previous month, Asia/Pacific, the largest region with one third of the worldwide capacity, recorded the second highest capacity increase with +8.2% year-on-year, reflecting an improved economic performance in the region in late 2013.

The worldwide result of December (+6.0%) is higher than the full-year result (+4.8%) by +1.2 points. Except for the two smallest regions (Latin America/Caribbean and Africa), all regions posted a higher growth in December than their respective year-to-date growth: Europe having the more positive significant difference with +1.6 points. This trend, assessed every month since July, confirms that the second half of 2013 has been stronger in terms of capacity increase than the first half.
